

# Housing

- ♦ The median value of owner-occupied housing (adjusted for inflation) was \$171,146 between 2014 and 2018, compared to \$195,784 in Idaho and \$208,613 in the US.
- ♦ The median value was the 18th highest out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2014 and 2018.
- ♦ The number of housing units increased by 38.6% from 2000 to 2018, compared to an increase of 34.8% in Idaho.




# **Income**

- ◆ The county's per capita income in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$49,162, compared to the state average of \$44,696 and the national average of \$55,433.
- ◆ Per capita income increased by 16.9% from 2008 to 2018, compared to an increase of 15.3% in Idaho and an increase of 14.1% in the US.
- ◆ The median household income (adjusted for inflation) was \$61,539 in 2018 compared to \$56,530 in Idaho and \$63,059 in the US.



# **Hispanic Population**

Bonneville County had 15,492 Hispanic residents in 2018.



# **Age Structure**

- ♦ 30.8% of Bonneville County's population was under 18 in 2018, in contrast to 25.5% in Idaho and 22.4% in the US.
- ♦ In 2018, 55.9% of the population was 18 to 64 years old, compared to 58.7% in Idaho and 61.5% in the US.
- ♦ Bonneville County's median age in 2018 was 32.9 compared to 36.6 in Idaho and 38.2 in the US.

**Note:** The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of inflation. Using the CPI to put dollar values in "real" terms makes it easier to see "inflation-free" change over time. Our base year is 2019, which means all dollar values are in terms of 2019 dollars.


# **COUNTY HIGHLIGHTS**

- ◆ Bonneville County's total population in 2018 was 116,854.
- ♦ In 2018, the median household income was \$61,539.
- ◆ Bonneville County's average annual unemployment rate was 2.4% in 2018.
- ♦ In 2018, Hispanic residents made up 13.3% of the population, compared to 12.7% in Idaho and 18.3% in the US.




# **Population Change**

- Bonneville Co. had 116,854 residents in 2018, 12,620 more than 2010.
- Population increased by 12.1 percent between 2010 and 2018, compared to an increase of 11.9 percent in Idaho as a whole.



- Bonneville County was the 6th fastest growing county out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2010 and 2018.
- ♦ Since 1970, Bonneville County has gained 64,397 residents.
- Bonneville County had a migration rate below & natural change rate that was above the state average between 2010 and 2018.




# **Employment**

- ◆ The average annual unemployment rate in 2018 was 2.4%, compared to 2.8% for Idaho and 3.9% for the US. Bonneville County ranked 37th—from highest to lowest—out of Idaho's 44 counties.
- ◆ The largest number of jobs in 2018 were provided by health care and social assistance, retail trade, and government.
- ♦ The number of jobs was 73,082 in 2018, compared to 22,210 in 1969—a 229% increase.

- ♦ In 2018, the self-employment rate was 24.8%, compared to 25.7% for Idaho and 23.1% for the US.
- ♦ The average wage per job in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$39,308, up from \$37,066 a decade earlier. The average was \$43,659 in Idaho and \$58,304 in the US.



# **Social Trends**

# **Educational Attainment**

In Bonneville County on average between 2014-2018...

- ♦ 8.3% of the population 25 years and older had no high school diploma, compared to 9.4% in Idaho and 12.3% in the US.
- ♦ 30.1% had a bachelor's degree or higher, compared to 26.9% in Idaho and 31.5% in the US.

# **Poverty**

- Bonneville County's overall poverty rate decreased from 10.9% in 2008 when the recession began to 10.6% in 2018.
- Statewide, the overall poverty rate in 2018 was 11.7% and the US rate was 13.1%.
- Bonneville County's child poverty rate (for people under 18) decreased from 13.7% in 2008 when the recession began to 13.2% in 2018.
- ♦ On average between 2014 and 2018, the poverty rate for people 65 and over was 7.1 percent.

# **Bonneville County Youth**

- ♦ The teen birth rate in 2017 was 6 per 1,000, compared to 6 per 1,000 in Idaho and 8 per 1,000 in the US.
- On average between 2014 and 2018, teens who were not working, looking for work, and not in school made up 6.1% of all youth aged 16-19, compared to 6.8% in Idaho and 6.8% in the US.

## Crime and Law Enforcement

In Bonneville County in 2018...

- ◆ The total number of crimes reported was 153 per 10,000 population, compared to 169 in Idaho and 258 in the US.
- ♦ The number of sworn police officers per 1,000 population was 1.4, compared to 1.6 in Idaho and 2.1 in the US.
