The ISU Library, Idaho Falls offers 10 public computers networked with the Idaho State University's and University of Idaho Library's catalogs and databases. The computers also have Microsoft Office. Printing is available.

BOOK A LIBRARIAN

The ISU Library, Idaho Falls is happy to provide in-depth, one-on-one or small group assistance. These sessions last 30-60 minutes and should be booked as early as possible in the research process. REQUEST BOOKS AND ARTICLES FROM POCATELLO

The Oboler Library has more than 600,000 books, and these can be ordered and delivered to the Idaho Falls campus at no cost to you.

After finding the title in the library catalog:

- · Click on the Request button
- Log in and choose Get me this Oboler Library book
- Choose the appropriate location for delivery
- The book will be available for pickup at the ISU Library, Idaho Falls in 2 days

DISCOVER NEW SUBJECT GUIDES

Browse by subject area (nursing, history, etc.) to find the best resources for finding articles, books, and other sources. Librarians have selected the top databases in each area to save you time and make searching easier. To find the guides, select the Resources by Subject link on the main library page.

FIND BOOKS IN THE LIBRARY

- · Go to www.isu.edu/library
- At the top of the page, find the Books & More tab (the box is labeled Search the Library catalog for books, films, and more.)
- Search for a book by:

TITLE Select Title from the drop-down menu and type the title into the search box. If the first word of the title is A, An, or The, omit it

AUTHOR Select Author from the drop-down menu and type the author's last name, then first name or initial into the search box

KEYWORD Select Keyword from the drop-down menu and type your keywords into the search box,

type your keywords into the search box connected with AND or OR

FIND eBOOKS

Check out our collection of over 110,000 eBooks.

- Go to http://opac.isu.edu
- Enter a quick search, keyword, author, title etc.
- Under Quick Limit, select eBook (no US documents)

You can also find eBooks when browsing the shelves in the Library. Look for the wooden blocks with QR codes.

Scan the code using a code reader on your phone or tablet (visit your device's app store for a free QR reader).



GROUP INSTRUCTION

Faculty, staff, and students can request group instruction to learn more about library services and how to use specific resources. These sessions can be as short as 15 minutes and as long as 2 hours.



REQUEST INTERLIBRARY LOAN

Books and articles that are not available at this Library can be obtained from other libraries free of charge.

- In the Library Quick Links, click on the Interlibrary Loan Request Form
- Login, read the information, and fill out the form
- Ask for help at (208) 282-7906 or at the Library

FIND MAGAZINE AND JOURNAL ARTICLES

- Go to www.isu.edu/library
- In the center of the page, you will see a section titled Find & Explore
- Click on Resources by Subject
- · Choose a subject area related to your topic
- · Choose the database you wish to search
- Many databases allow you to limit your search results to full-text and scholarly articles
- Search the A-Z Journal List to see if the ISU Library has access to a particular magazine or journal
- Call (208) 282-7906 or stop by the Library for help

USE SIMULTANEOUS SEARCHES

Use OneSearch to quickly locate a wealth of resources. It will search the Library catalog and millions of scholarly eResources (journal articles, eBooks, reviews, legal documents, and more).

- Go to www.isu.edu/library
- At the top of the page, find the tab labeled One Search
- Click on the tab, choose OneSearch students, faculty and staff login, and login with your ISU ID number and last name
- Ask for help at (208) 282-3152 or at the Reference Desk

ACCESS COURSE RESERVES

- Go to www.isu.edu/library
- In the Library Quick Links, select Course Reserves
- Select the name of your professor or course from the appropriate drop-down menu
- · Click on the Search button
- The items your professor has placed on reserve will be listed
- Your professor will give you a password to access online documents
- To check out books on reserve, show your ISU ID at the desk
