Navigating the New Project Requirements

Ever wonder what makes a project a project? Every project has a Project Requirement Sheet that lays out what is needed to complete a project. Project Requirement Sheets can be found at this <u>link</u>. Each project has two pages that lists lots of information for a specific project. The entire catalog of project requirement sheets were updated for the 2022-2023 4-H year.

The first page of each project requirement sheet contains the following: the name of the project, age requirement, how the project is listed in ZSuite, the last 4-H year that the requirements were revised, a project description, youth materials, volunteer materials, and optional support materials are all listed. Be sure to check out all of these materials for your project(s).

The second page of each project requirement sheet has the Project Completion Checklist. Statewide Requirements are listed here and must be completed for each project. Many of these requirements are standard: 5 activities in your project area, an oral presentation, a ZSuite record book, and an Involvement Report. However some are project specific such as a number of days you must own an animal, specific pages in your project book that must be completed, and a number of animals that must be raised. Also on that page is a list of What You Can Exhibit at Fair. All projects must be exhibited and do not have to be exhibited at fair (with permission from the Extension Office, you can exhibit publicly elsewhere). No matter where your project is exhibited, the project requirement lists what can be exhibited for project completion.

Also on the second page, is a note about Additional Local Requirements. In Canyon County, we have one additional local requirement: Project Interview Evaluation. Youth do an interview with a caring adult that looks through all of their project record books and youth reflect on their project year. At this interview, youth complete their public display of their Involvement Report and Project Record Book(s).

We try to give a copy of Project Requirements with any project manuals purchased through our office, but, if you do not have a current copy of your project requirement sheet, we encourage you to download one. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to contact us.



2023 Canyon County Fair Market Tag and Declaration Information

In 2023, all market species and horses will complete declarations through an online process. Please note that the declaration process is separate from your fair entry. Declaration due dates are scheduled by species and listed below. Declarations are not required for breeding animals and small animals. Prior to tags being available participants need to be enrolled in the correct market project in Zsuite.

Members must reserve tags by midnight the night before tag pick up day at canyoncountyfair.org. Tags should be placed in the animals left ear (when you stand over the animal)

THERE ARE NO IN-PERSON WEIGH-INS FOR ANY SPECIES.

Tags will be available on the following date: Saturday, April 29, 2023

Due dates are very by species.

Bringing Your 4-H Project Animal Home



READ ALL ABOUT IT!!!

Although bringing your 4-H animal project home can be exciting, it can also be extremely stressful! Don't worry – bringing a new animal to your property can be scary – and if this is your first time, here are some tips to help make the transition from farm to home a bit easier. First, remember you won't be the only one experiencing stress when selecting and transporting your animal. Whether it be 10 miles or 100 miles, the movement and transportation of animals is one of the leading causes of stress in the animal industry. Removing animals form their

familiar place can create stress, therefore, it's important to remain quiet while selecting, loading, and transporting your new animals. As a tip for new animal owners – before leaving with your new animal, ask the producer/owner what vet they use/recommend. Having a vet incase of emergencies that can specialize in the health of your animal will come in handy in times of need.

Once you've reached your destination – allow the animal to sit for a moment before removing them and placing them into their new holding area. While your animal is relaxing this could be a great time to make sure that your pen is secure and ready to hold your new animal. Are the corners tight together, can they dig under the fence, do they have clean water, do they have a shade place or shelter? Double checking that your pen is equipped before placing any new animal inside can help reduce the chance of injury or escapes. Once you've double checked your holding area, you may now transport your animal from trailer, kennel, or truck, into their new home.

Again, it's extremely important to be patient and quiet during this process. This animal is new to your farm and does not know the "ins and outs" of how you want them to work (just yet). If you are introducing new animals to an already established herd, or area with animals that live on the property permanently, it's important to try and reduce nose-to-nose contact as much as possible. Transportation can lead to stress, which can cause sickness to appear in animals that may of seemed healthy at selection. If you are able too, try to keep your new projects separated from all other animals for at least 30 days before allowing any co-mingling to take place. After you remove the new animal it's important to clean and disinfect equipment like your trailer, truck, clothing, and shoes used during transportation. This can help reduce the spread of disease from farms off site on to your farm. Always remember to have fun and enjoy your time with your project. Successful projects are done by those who are willing to put in the extra work and time. If you have any questions on shelter, feeding, watering, or the care of your animals feel free to reach out to your local extension office, veterinarian, producers, or other 4-H members for advice.



- 1. All photos **must** include declared horse with the purposed exhibitor.
- 2. The First photo should be the full frontal view of the horse (Ears to Hooves), with exhibitor.
- 3. The Second photo should be close up of the horses full right side (Nose to Tail & Ears to Hooves), with exhibitor.
- 4. The Third photo should be close up of the horses full left side (Nose to Tail & Ears to Hooves), with exhibitor.


