Every year Canyon County (and counties throughout the country) receive requests to join 4-H clubs. One of the biggest problems in placing members is there aren't enough openings in existing clubs. Club volunteer leaders can only take on so many members and still effectively mentor the youth they are working with. So how can we find places for the over 200 youth on the Canyon County 4-H interest list?

- More adults volunteering. If each adult can only work with so many youth, then logically we need more adults to sign up as volunteers. This is easier said than done in today's busy world. However, many adults think of volunteering for 4-H in a narrow way and the time can be surprisingly flexible. Think outside the box!
  - <sup>a</sup> You can volunteer to be a STEP (Short Term Enrollment Project) volunteer which allows you to schedule your time.
  - <sup>1</sup> You can volunteer with an existing club to lead youth through a specific project. This would help the other volunteers in that club immensely.
  - You can also volunteer to take on an administrative role with the club, like attending county leaders' meetings, helping with club communication, etc.
  - <sup>a</sup> Where to get started? Start by filling out a 4-H volunteer application from the Extension Office.
  - Start a new club. More clubs mean more open spots for new folks to join 4-H. Any certified and enrolled volunteer can work with a group of 5 members from 3 different families to start a new club. Let the Extension office know you are forming, what your new club name will be, and we can help with the paperwork.
- Mentor new volunteers and clubs. For those of you who have been around awhile, one thing that is proven to get new volunteers and clubs off the ground is mentorship from those who have been there and done that. If you are interested, please let the Extension Office know.

## 2023 Canyon County Fair Market Tag and Declaration Information

In 2023, all market species and horses will complete declarations through an online process. Please note that the declaration process is separate from your fair entry. Declaration due dates are scheduled by species and listed below. Declarations are not required for breeding animals and small animals. Prior to tags being available participants will need to be enrolled in correct market project in Zsuite. I Members will need to reserve tags by midnight the night before at canyoncountyfair.org. Tags should be placed in the animals left ear (when you stand over the animal) **NEW AND IMPORTANT INFORMATION** THERE ARE NO IN-PERSON WEIGH-INS FOR ANY SPECIES. Tags will be available as follows: Saturday, January 28, 2023 Sheep/Goat Saturday, April 29, 2023 Beef **Swine** Saturday, March 25, 2023 Declarations will be completed online at https://canyonsale.fairwire.com by the following dates: Monday, February 27, 2023 Sheep/Goat Monday, May 15, 2023 Beef Swine Monday, April 17, 2023 Monday, April 10, 2023 (Intent to Participate) Market Broiler Saturday, April 15, 2023 Horse Fair Entries for all animals are due by June 15, 2023 Youth participating in market animal/horse projects must be enrolled in that project and active in Zsuite prior to the declaration deadlines.

- Be screened, trained and appointed as a current 4-H volunteer through their local County Extension Office
- Successfully complete instructor discipline training administered/sanctioned through the University of Idaho 4-H Youth Development Office
- Be trained and certified in any discipline(s) that they are teaching at the county level
- Participants must attend the entire training and successfully complete all aspects to receive their respective discipline certification
