## **4-H Story Guidelines**

Type of Story—Madison County requires a 4-H Story based on the total 4-H experience for the current year. This means it should include items such as

1. 4-H Camp, day camps, clinics, jackpots, service projects, and leadership experiences.

Writing Your Story—Tell things you did, experienced, or learned by participating in 4-H. Be sure to tell about important items not found in your record books.

- 1. Introduce yourself. Include why you joined 4-H and/or chose the projects you did.
- 2. Tell about things you enjoyed learning or doing (experience)
- 3. Tell about results, difficulties, or challenges you had (share)
- 4. Explain how you would improve your project(s) or 4-H year. (process)
- 5. Tell what you learned about yourself through your 4-H participation (generalize)
- 6. Explain how you could use the life and/or project skills you learned in other areas of your life (apply)

Length and Format Guidelines—you can type or handwrite your story. If you handwrite the story, use pencil or ink on lined white notebook paper. If a typewriter or computer is used to write the story, use double line spacing on plain white paper. Write on one side of the paper. Leave a wide enough margin so the story can be read if inserted into a report cover. The length of the story should be within the following guidelines:

Juniors (8-10 year olds): 1/2 to 4 pages—the half page should be limited to younger juniors.

Intermediate (11-13 year olds): 1 to 6 pages

Seniors (14-18 year olds): 1-8 pages

#### Youth ability should be taken into consideration.

Story should be inserted in the portfolio in the order of the portfolio checklist.

### **Other Record Book Judging Information:**

- 1. Market livestock books should include species required forms:
  - a. Growth chart, Planning & record sheet, Cost & returns estimate
- 2. Some projects may require skills check lists (check state requirements)
- 3. All other 4-H Projects
  - a. No other required books or forms unless the leader is requiring them (example CCS Book)
