## PROJECT CAMPS & DAY CAMPS



We are excited about the Project Camps being offered this year. Please be aware that these camps fill up quickly. If your child is interested please sign them up at your earliest convenience. To participate the youth must be enrolled in 4-H (\$20 enrollment fee). As part of participating in the camps, all participants will be required to fill out a record book and leave their fair project for exhibit in the fair.

Projects may be picked up at the Extension office after the fair.



Due to the high demand, we have limited the initial enrollment to 1<sup>st</sup>-time participants per project until May 1<sup>st</sup>. After May 1<sup>st</sup>, camps will be open to enrollment to ALL youth even if they have participated in the project in the past.

June 5-9	9:00-11:00 daily	Cake Decorating Level 1	\$15.00	Start your cake decorating kit. Learn decorating techniques including how to frost a cake, basic tips, and their uses. Decorate your very own cake
June 5-9	1:00-3:00 daily	Cake Decorating Level 2	\$20.00	Build on techniques learned in level one. Frost and decorate a 2-layer cake, work with fondant.
June 19, 21,23	8:00-11 Mon (19th) 8:00-1 Wed (21st) 7:00-5 Fri (23rd)	Hiking and Outdoors 	\$30.00	Spend time outdoors on 3 different local hikes. Learn about wildflowers and native plants. Learn about safety while hiking. Learn the importance of preparing before starting a hike and put together a hiking pack.
June 26-29	9:00-10:30 daily	Drones (S.T.E.M)	\$12.00	Drones are a huge part of our future. Youth will learn about different careers in the drone industry, learn about safety and drone ethics, and have lots of time to fly drones and create a video of their drone footage.
July 10-14	9:00-11:00 daily 	Rocketry (S.T.E.M)	\$25.00	Learn about and experiment with different types of propulsion while building rockets. Send a capsule up into space without damaging your precious cargo.

July 10-14	1:00-3:00 daily 	Baking	\$15.00	Learn how to follow a recipe, measure liquids and solids, and why certain ingredients are important like yeast and baking powder. Bake cookies, cake, and bread from scratch. Grind your own wheat while learning about the importance of eating healthy.
July 17-21	9:00-11:00 daily 	Beginning Sewing	\$30.00	Learn the parts of and how to work a sewing machine, sew straight and curved stitches, and start a sewing kit. Sew pajama pants.
July 17-21	1:00-2:00 pm	Lego Robotics (S.T.E.M) Age 8-10	\$10.00	Lego Robotics Spike Essentials is a beginning robotics course where participants learn beginning engineering and programming skills.
July 24-27	9:00-11:00 am daily	Floral Arranging	\$15.00	Learn about floral arranging, how to care for cut flowers, and create a corsage or boutonniere
July 24-27	1:00-2:30 daily	Crochet	\$12.00	Learn how to chain, single crochet, read a basic pattern, and crochet a fun project.
July 24-27	3:00-4:30 daily	Lego Robotics Prime Age 11+	\$10.00	Lego Robotics Prime is a more advanced robotics course for older youth with a basic understanding of engineering and programming.

# SHOOTING SPORTS CAMP

Our 4-H shooting sports programs are taught by certified shooting sports instructors. Learn range safety, shooting etiquette, and proper shooting techniques while having fun with other youth in a fun and educational environment. We offer disciplines in rifle, archery, shotgun, and pistol. We will be holding our 2nd Annual 4-H Shooting Sports Camp on June 24, 2023. Youth must be active in 4-H to participate.

How it works...you must pre-register and pay the class fees to participate in the camp. Registration will be submitted on the zsuite website or through the Madison County Extension office until June 5, 2023. This camp will be on a first-come basis and will fill up fast.

Youth who are 8-18 years of age by January 1, 2023, are eligible to participate (no exceptions). Parents are responsible for transportation to and from camp.

## CAMP FACTS

- Participants MUST attend the 1<sup>st</sup> hour of the camp-NO EXCEPTIONS. If you are unable to attend the 1<sup>st</sup> hour, please don't sign up. This will be the safety portion of the camp and all participants are required to be there. Participants will receive a wristband upon completion of this session and will not be allowed in any other sessions without the wristband.
- Parents are welcome to stay and rotate the classes with the participants, HOWEVER no kids under the age of 8 (Jan. 1) AND/OR not enrolled in 4-H will be allowed at the camp. This is for insurance and safety reasons.
- Lunch will be served and included in the price of the camp. If parents want to eat they may purchase a lunch for \$5.
- Participants are welcome to come and go during the camp if there is a session they won't be attending (with the exception of the opening Safety Session). Parents if you take your child please let an adult in charge know.
- All disciplines will be represented in the sessions, along with some fun shooting sports and outdoor activity sessions
- A t-shirt and lunch will be included in the camp fee. There may be sessions that require an additional fee/cost. This will be paid upon registration and will be noted on the registration form.
