

# Creative Writing Emphasis (39 credits)

## Curriculum Check Sheet

This check sheet may be used as a loose guide for graduating in four years. Majors do not need to follow these plans exactly, but these are strategies for successful completion of degree requirements; however, all students need to consult every semester with their advisors to make sure they are on track.

### Genre Craft/Workshop Courses: (15 cr)

The student must take a full numerical sequence in one genre (291/391/491, poetry; 292/392/492, fiction; or 293/393/493, nonfiction). This would be his/her *major genre*. In addition, the student must take two additional courses in creative writing, in other genre(s), at the 200- or 300-level.
