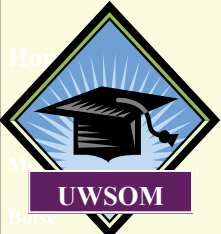

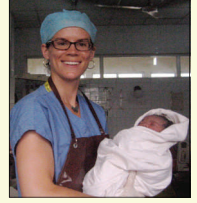

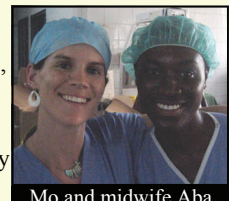


“INCREDIBLE EXPERIENCE” - Obstetrics in Kumasi, Ghana

Imagine a hot muggy room filled with 10 pregnant women laboring side by side in small beds. Women are moaning in agony and screaming “Oh Jesus” in the local language with each contraction. There are no family members or support, no fetal heart rate monitoring or analgesics. Within that room are two old rusty delivery beds that are occupied by women about to deliver. Beside them is a midwife frantically putting on sterile gloves and a plastic apron to catch the baby. In the hallway, outside this room, is a line of pregnant women laboring on a long wooden bench waiting for a bed in the labor room to free up. Welcome to Komfo Anokye labor unit, in Kumasi, Ghana, the second largest referral hospital in Ghana, which averages 15,000 deliveries per year. I had the opportunity to spend the last 2 months of medical school in Ghana and spent a month doing obstetrics and gynecology at Komfo Anokye. It was one of the most rewarding and challenging medical experiences I have ever had. I had the opportunity to deliver numerous babies, assist in surgery and see patients in clinic. I learned how to practice medicine with extremely limited resources and staff. Most importantly, this experience really challenged me to differentiate what I believed was “standard of care” versus a different mode of delivering care than I was accustomed to. Though our health care system in the US is fraught with problems we are fortunate for obstetrical resources we have. Despite the limited medical resources in Ghana, I was struck by the resilience and strength of the Ghanaian women. I watched many lose babies, struggle with extremely painful and difficult labors and suffer through illnesses, such as malaria. They persevered these situations with minimal complaints, and a sense of stoicism that I do not see often in the US. Overall, this was one of the most valuable experiences I have had in medical school. I hope I can carry the lessons I learned in Ghana forth into residency and my career, and I look forward to returning abroad again soon.

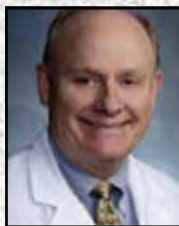

Idaho SEARCH Program Team Up

The Idaho WWAMI Rural Underserved Opportunities Program (R/UOP) and Idaho SEARCH have teamed up to connect medical students to underserved communities throughout Idaho. Both programs provide students with early exposure to the challenges and rewards of practicing primary care medicine in a rural or underserved setting. Together these two programs are offering an enhanced experience to WWAMI R/UOP students. WWAMI R/UOP students that participate in Idaho SEARCH are eligible to receive funding to help with living and travel expenses, and are covered under the UWSOM medical student liability policy.

This summer, three WWAMI students will complete an Idaho R/UOP-SEARCH experience:
