<p><b>Admission:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Apply to undergraduate admissions at UI <a href="http://www.uidaho.edu/admissions">www.uidaho.edu/admissions</a> if you haven't already.</li> <li>○ If you are not a current NIC student, you need to apply/reapply for admission- <a href="http://www.nic.edu/admissions">www.nic.edu/admissions</a>.</li> </ul> <p><b>Financial Aid:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ <u>You may only receive financial aid through one institution per semester, per student. If you are concurrently with NIC, UI is the home institution and your financial aid is to be administered by UI.</u></li> <li>○ Apply for admission and submit a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) by February 15<sup>th</sup> to be considered for the maximum amount of UI financial aid. UI's FAFSA school code is 001626.</li> <li>○ To be eligible for financial aid at UI, you must be enrolled at least half-time (6 credits per semester for undergraduates, 5 credits per semester for graduate students). Most state aid programs and university scholarships require full-time enrollment (12 credits per semester for undergraduates, 9 for graduate students). Pro-rated Pell Grants may also be awarded to undergraduate students who attend less than full-time and are seeking their first bachelor's degree.</li> <li>○ Your NIC and UI credits can be combined to calculate enrollment, but you must have at least one credit at the UI to receive financial aid from UI. Students who qualify for the Go Idaho, Discover Idaho or National Merit Scholar programs or are receiving other institutionally-funded scholarships from UI must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 UI credits. Other university scholarships require at least 12 total credits with a minimum of 6 UI credits.</li> <li>○ Please note: If a student is concurrently enrolled and has 70 or more transfer credits already completed, the UI Registrar will not approve any classes for financial aid which are not strictly required for the student's degree.</li> <li>○ Complete a <i>Concurrent Enrollment Form</i> (yellow form) and submit to NIC Registrar's Office <u>after</u> you have registered for NIC courses (see below).</li> </ul> <p><b>Registration at NIC:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ If you are a new student at NIC, the first semester you attend NIC you must meet with an NIC advisor before registering for classes.</li> <li>○ Registration dates vary per semester, but generally Summer/Fall registration begins in April and Spring registration begins in November.</li> <li>○ You can view the NIC class schedule and register for</li> </ul>	<p><b>Admission:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Apply to undergraduate admissions at UI <a href="http://www.uidaho.edu/admissions">www.uidaho.edu/admissions</a> if you haven't already.</li> <li>○ If you are not a current LC student, you need to apply/reapply for admission as a non-degree seeking student <a href="http://www.lcsc.edu/admissions">www.lcsc.edu/admissions</a>.</li> </ul> <p><b>Financial Aid:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ <u>You may only receive financial aid through one institution per semester, per student. Other university scholarships require at least 12 total credits with a minimum of 6 UI credits.</li> <li>○ Complete a <i>Consortium Agreement Form</i> (Green Form) if you are registered less than full time at UI.</li> </ul> <p><b>Registration at LC:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ As a non-degree seeking student at LC, you can enroll up to 11 credits per semester and you are limited to a total of 30 credits from LC. If you earn more than 30 credits from LC, you will be required to declare a major (and apply as a degree-seeking student).</li> </ul>

**Paying Your Fees:**

- Please note that concurrently enrolled students are required to remit fees to NIC and UI separately.
- If you need to defer your fees at NIC before the start of a given term, you may submit a copy of your accepted, signed UI award letter to the NIC Business Office. Your financial aid award must be sufficient to cover your NIC costs. If your financial aid is insufficient to pay your NIC tuition, you will be responsible for paying the difference in accordance with NIC's published dates.

**At the End of the Semester:**

- Make sure you order an official NIC transcript and have it sent to the UI Registrar's office. The transcript request form can be found at [www.nic.edu/registrar](http://www.nic.edu/registrar).

- After you receive an admission letter or email, you may view the class schedule and register for classes online at [www.warriorweb.lcsc.edu](http://www.warriorweb.lcsc.edu).

- If you are taking a class at LC that requires a pre-requisite, you must bring a copy of your UI unofficial transcripts to the LC CDA office to verify you have satisfied the pre-requisite.

**Paying Your Fees:**

- Please note that concurrently enrolled students are required to remit fees to UI and LC separately.
- Pay required tuitions/fees to LC-CDA Business Office before the semester begins.

**At the End of the Semester:**

- Have an official LCSC transcript sent to UI's Admission office. The transcript request form is at [www.lcsc.edu/registrar](http://www.lcsc.edu/registrar). Remember that your signature and a payment is ALWAYS required to release your transcript from any institution.
