Bachelor of Science in Psychology

- Program includes the study of developmental processes, social psychology, learning and memory, personality, clinical psychology, biological processes, and sensation/perception.

Undergraduate Degree Requirements:

- 128 semester credits, and a final GPA of 2.50 or higher
- 36 upper division (300-400 level) credits
- At least 32 of your upper division credits must come from the University of Idaho
- Fulfill the State Board Core Requirements, CLASS requirements, and Psychology Department requirements
- A maximum of 70 hours from a community college can be applied towards a bachelors degree
