# Ties to the Land:

## *A Succession Planning for Owners of Farm, Range, or Forest Land*

Millions of acres of family-owned forests, agricultural land, and rangeland in the U.S. will change hands in the next few years. Some rural lands may be converted to a different use because owners didn't take charge of the succession process in time. There are many reasons for this:

- ◆ Landowners may have a strong desire to pass their land on to their children but have not yet done the work necessary to ensure that result.
- ◆ Many landowners haven't talked to their children about who will take care of their land after they're gone.
- ◆ Some owners have realized their children may lack the skills to manage the family land or may not be interested in doing so.
- ◆ Others assume that succession planning will be too expensive, and they aren't sure what the benefits will be.
- ◆ Other owners wait for the children to take the initiative. Or maybe they just don't know what to do next.
