Why Scaling & Marketing?

Marketing timber is not a task most forest owners do every day. When you cut trees, you want to get the best possible price for them and best utilization of the tree into logs.

That is easier to accomplish to the degree you understand basic concepts of how logs are measured and valued, then study markets to learn which mills are paying more for logs with specific characteristics.

This program will help landowners, loggers, and others interested in this topic better understand these issues and integrate them into decisions on log marketing, log manufacturing, and timber sale contracts.
