\$718,304 in Competitive Grants Awarded to Faculty Members.

University of Idaho faculty members of the Institute for Bioinformatics and Evolutionary Studies (IBEST) were awarded \$718,304 in competitive grants as part of the NSF BEACON Science and Technology Center on "Evolution in Action". The award will be dispersed over two years. \$513,304 for 2013-14 academic year, and \$204,836 for the 2014-15 academic year. [Read more.](#)
