## **U-Idaho Extension to Deliver Master Water Steward Training to Sandpoint and Boise**

University of Idaho Extension's Master Water Steward program, IDAH2O, got a boost in

2012 with a \$77,000 EPA Environmental Education grant. The funding will allow the popular citizen-science training to reach more Idahoans. The grant also funds the development of an online web mapping service to host water monitoring data now being collected by some 75 trained volunteer water stewards in Idaho.
