Upcoming Flu Shot Clinic

An upcoming flu shot clinic will occur Sept. 26 from 9 a.m. - 2 p.m. in the Silver-Gold / Galena room in the Student Union Building, sponsored by the Division of Finance and Administration. The clinic is free for all faculty, staff and temporary employees and their family members who are over 18.

Administration Building Hallway Closure

As a rule, if no petition is received the report will be submitted to the president for approval and transmittal to the regents, if regents' action is required. If a petition is received, the report will be referred to the Faculty Senate.
