In his speech "The Future of Flagship Universities" in 1998, former University of California, Berkeley chancellor Robert M. The University of Idaho Department of Theatre Arts will welcome Robin Goodrin Nordli to campus for a public question and answer session 12:30-1:30 p.m. Wednesday in the Hartung Theater. Goodrin Nordli has been a leading actress with the Tony Award-winning Oregon Shakespeare Festival for 18 years. Goodrin Nordli will be at the U-Idaho campus Wednesday

and Thursday, taking part in acting workshops and helping students. OSF, founded in 1935, is one of the nation's largest and oldest theatre festivals. Over the years, Goodrin Nordli has played 53 roles in 42 festival productions. Some of her roles include Lady Macbeth in Macbeth, Boyet in Love's Labor's Lost, Maria in Twelfth Night and Ruth in The Pirates of Penzance. In 2001 she created the one-woman show Bard Babes, a look at the challenges of playing female characters in works by William Shakespeare. She has performed the production for OSF as well as the Shakespeare Theatre Association of America, Cincinnati Playhouse-in-the-Park and on the Holland America Cruise Line.
