The magazine, *Real Simple* will highlight Kim's novel in its June issue, the novel being included as one of "Seven Addictive Summer Novels." Barnes' essay, "What Mad Men Means to Me," was published in the *Wall Street Journal*. Barnes and poet, Robert Wrigley will be included in the forthcoming *West of 98: Living and Writing the New American West*. The anthology of essays and poetry features more than 60 western writers, and is edited by Lynn Stegner and Russell Rowland.
