

Colleagues and Off-Campus College of Education Graduate Students,

I am pleased to inform you that funding has now been made available in the College of Education to help support off-campus graduate students' research, scholarly, and creative activities. Specifically, funding has been allocated to help support students not eligible for SGP or GPSA funds in the form of Project Grants (i.e., support research activities and excludes personnel costs) as well as Dissemination Awards to present this activity. Because the College of Education Off-Campus Graduate Student Grant Program is funded from UI College of Education off-campus graduate student fees, funding is limited to \$3,000 available funding per semester or \$6,000 total available funding per academic year. It is anticipated that this funding will be highly competitive. The College of Education Administration and Graduate Policy and Research Committee (GRPC) agreed to adapt the policies and procedures of the Student Grant Program to meet the needs and serve the interests of off-campus graduate students in Education. While the maximum of a single award is \$1,000, most awards will range from \$100 to \$500. Only complete applications will be considered and incomplete applications will not be reviewed.
