Degree Total

A minimum of 30 semester credits for the non-thesis option or a minimum of 36 semester credits for the thesis option is required. The combined total of transfer credits, correspondence credits, non-degree credits, and approved credits more than eight years old at the time the degree is awarded shall not exceed 12 credits for masters programs requiring 36 or fewer credits, and shall not exceed one-third of the total credits in programs requiring more than 36 credits.
