CLINICAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS

In September, 2011, I became the first director of the new [Economic Development Clinic](#) at the University of Idaho, College of Law’s Boise campus. Major accomplishments from the Clinic include:

- [*Area of City Impact Agreements in Idaho*](#) (2012), an 800-page review of 125 agreements negotiated by Idaho cities and counties governing the growth of cities.
- Drafting an overarching administrative enforcement ordinance, adopted into law by Teton County, Idaho, the first such ordinance in use in Idaho (Teton County Code, Title 1, Chapter 10).
- Assisting rural county in revising its development agreement template for future development.
- Advising a rural city in formation of ambulance taxing district, including sub-issues such as creating a joint powers authority district; budgeting matters in light of statutory restrictions on future revenue increases; and numerous other issues.
- Advising a new rural economic development council on nonprofit corporation formation (e.g., 501(c)(3), (c)(4), (c)(6)).

Other projects have included: advising an urban city on funding sources for redevelopment of a former industrial area; advising a rural county on development agreements related to a legacy of half-built foreclosed subdivisions; and advising an urban city and local businesses in drafting an “exports initiative.”
