ASUI ANNOUNCES FALL 2011 ELECTION RESULTS

MOSCOW, Idaho—Associated Students University of Idaho hosted the first-ever districted Senate election Nov. 14-16. Results were announced Nov. 16 at 8 p.m. in the rotunda of the Idaho Commons. The new ASUI Senators are as follows:

Voter turnout was unusually high for a fall election, with 1,408 undergraduate students participating. This was a 25 percent increase from the spring 2011 election, when 1,126 students voted.

Samantha Perez, ASUI president, expressed her excitement for the newly elected members of ASUI

“We are really excited for our new seven senators, and I’m really excited to see all of the great things they will accomplish during their term,” Perez said. “Additionally, I know that we had a really great pool of candidates to select from, and to those who were not elected this fall, please don’t be discouraged. We still want you to be involved in ASUI and there are many great opportunities for you to do so.”

Perez also said she was pleased with the voter turnout.

“Thank you students for participating in elections, it’s very important, these students represent you on very important issues,” Perez said.
