VandaLink is a joint program between North Idaho College (NIC) and the University of Idaho which allows a smooth and efficient transfer process from NIC to the University of Idaho upon completion of an AA or AS degree. In order to participate in VandaLink, NIC students must successfully complete an associate degree (AA or AS) from NIC and identify their desire to transfer to University of Idaho to continue their education. NIC students may join the VandaLink program at any point in their NIC career, but no later than the term that they earn 45 degree applicable credits.

PROCESS

- » Apply and be accepted to North Idaho College.
- » Complete the VandaLink @ NIC Application (no later than the term that you earn 45 degree applicable credits).
- » Meet with a NIC advisor at least once each semester in order to create and maintain an accurate educational plan.
- » Meet with the University of Idaho Transfer Admissions Counselor to submit an application and all required documents to the University of Idaho during the term in which you will earn 45 degree applicable credits.
- » Apply for graduation at NIC by the published deadline in the term you will complete your degree requirements.

* Limited and selective access programs may require additional admissions requirements/processes. Students will be guaranteed admission to the University of Idaho, providing they meet the minimum grade point average from all postsecondary courses taken at all accredited institutions and present satisfactory evidence of good character as indicated in the Additional Information section of the application for admission.
