Overview:

The Idaho 4-H Leadership Retreat will focus on teen leadership, living with purpose and service, as well as unifying the 4-H organization on the district and state levels through a series of team building activities, workshops, speakers and projects. The ideals of this retreat also correspond to the 4-H Mission—
“Empowering youth to reach their full potential, working and learning in partnership with caring adults, and the 4-H Vision—”A world in which youth and adults learn, grow and work together as catalysts for positive change,” to maximize the impact of the agenda.

Who:

The retreat is available to 4-Hers in the State of Idaho who are **between 13 and 18 on January 1**, and have completed the 8th grade, but have not entered college.

What:

The retreat is created for teens, by teens and will incorporate ideas that they will want to see. It is designed with service, purpose and development of life skills in mind, and has the support of adult 4-H professionals and volunteers.

Where:

The retreat will be held at the University of Idaho McCall Outdoor Science School (MOSS Camp) located beside Payette Lake and adjacent to Ponderosa State Park.

Cost:

The retreat cost is **\$100 per person** and includes room and board and all activities and materials. A limited number of chaperones will have their expenses covered by the retreat in exchange for their help with the retreat.
