

Idaho Friends of 4-H College Scholarship

Purpose. The Idaho Friends of 4-H Board offers scholarships to assist Idaho 4-H members with post-high school education in Idaho.

Eligibility. <u>Scholarship for upperclassmen (sophomore, junior, or senior)</u>: Applicant must be enrolled in an Idaho university, college or technical school and have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5. Applicant must have been an Idaho 4-H member for at least 4 years. Two of the four years must have been during High School. Proof of enrollment in college must be provided before receiving scholarship.

Selection Process. Incomplete applications will not be considered. Applications are evaluated on the basis of five broad criteria, as shown on the scorecard. Upperclassman cannot receive scholarship more than once.

Due Date. For Upperclassman applicants: Complete the Friends of 4-H Application #91808 and follow the application packet instructions below. Mail completed application (keep a copy for your records) to the address provided on form or email as a pdf file to fourh@uidaho.edu. Applications must be postmarked or submitted online by February 1, 2015.

Application Packet Instructions

Information Required as Part of Your Upplerclassman Application packet. To be considered as a scholarship candidate, you must include the following items in your application packet (in this order):

- The completed two-page application form.
- Two page essay. Follow the essay guidelines within application.
- 4-H Career Resume, a one-page resume that includes: 1) the projects you have taken and the years involved, 2) your leadership experiences and responsibilities (i.e., offices held and duties, 4-H ambassador activities, etc.), 3) projects or activities as a Teen Leader and 4) state and national level experiences/activities.
- One copy of your high school/college transcript(s); (unofficial or official)
- One letter of recommendation from a high school or college advisor.
- One letter of recommendation from a 4-H Leader or Extension Educator (someone who knows your 4-H work but is not a close relative).
- Letter from doctor for Craig scholarship

Format. Use plain white $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" paper with 1" margins. Print on one side only. Use 11 to 12-point Times or Courier font. Single-space. Stapled.
