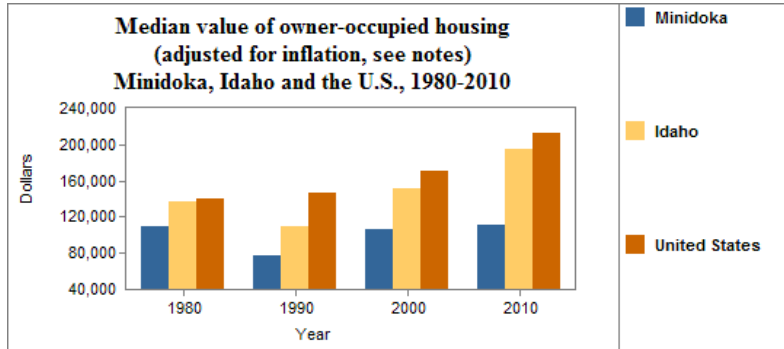


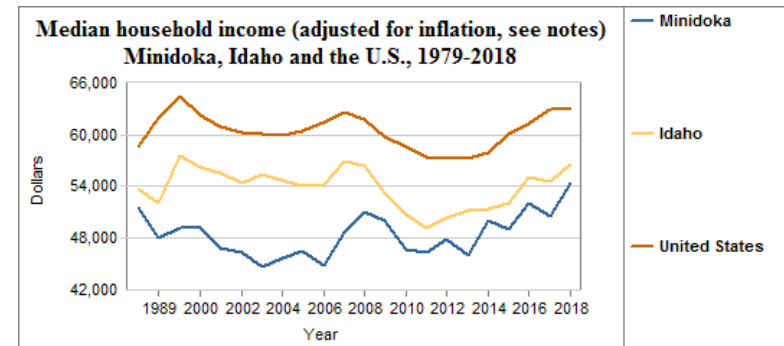
Housing

- ◆ The median value of owner-occupied housing (adjusted for inflation) was \$139,279 between 2014 and 2018, compared to \$195,784 in Idaho and \$208,613 in the US.
- ◆ The median value was the 39th highest out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2014 and 2018.
- ◆ The number of housing units increased by 7.8% from 2000 to 2018, compared to an increase of 34.8% in Idaho.



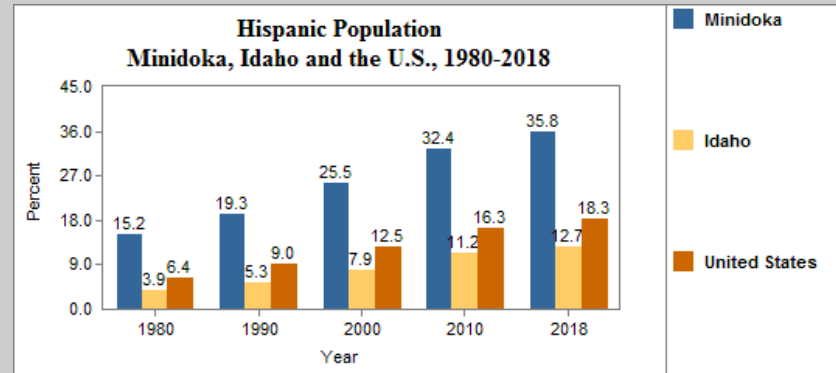
Income

- ◆ The county's per capita income in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$38,850, compared to the state average of \$44,696 and the national average of \$55,433.
- ◆ Per capita income increased by 13.2% from 2008 to 2018, compared to an increase of 15.3% in Idaho and an increase of 14.1% in the US.
- ◆ The median household income (adjusted for inflation) was \$54,415 in 2018 compared to \$56,530 in Idaho and \$63,059 in the US.



Hispanic Population

- ◆ Minidoka County had 7,462 Hispanic residents in 2018.



Age Structure

- ◆ 28.4% of Minidoka County's population was under 18 in 2018, in contrast to 25.5% in Idaho and 22.4% in the US.
- ◆ In 2018, 55.4% of the population was 18 to 64 years old, compared to 58.7% in Idaho and 61.5% in the US.
- ◆ Minidoka County's median age in 2018 was 35.1 compared to 36.6 in Idaho and 38.2 in the US.

Note: The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of inflation. Using the CPI to put dollar values in "real" terms makes it easier to see "inflation-free" change over time. 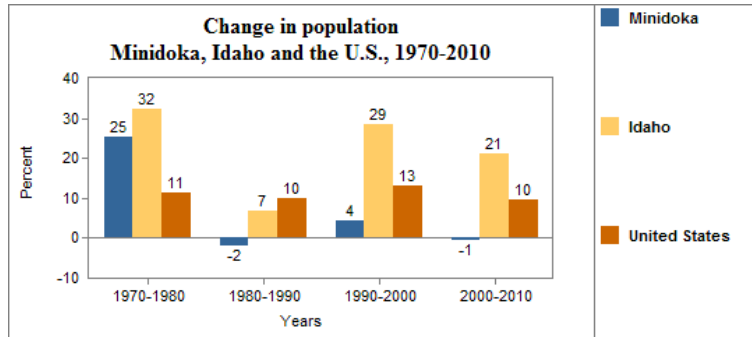
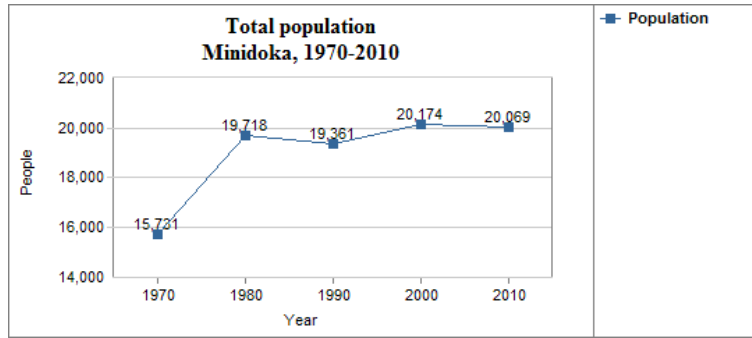
COUNTY HIGHLIGHTS

- ◆ **Minidoka County's total population in 2018 was 20,825.**
- ◆ **In 2018, the median household income was \$54,415.**
- ◆ **Minidoka County's average annual unemployment rate was 2.5% in 2018.**
- ◆ **In 2018, Hispanic residents made up 28.4% of the population, compared to 12.7% in Idaho and 18.3% in the US.**

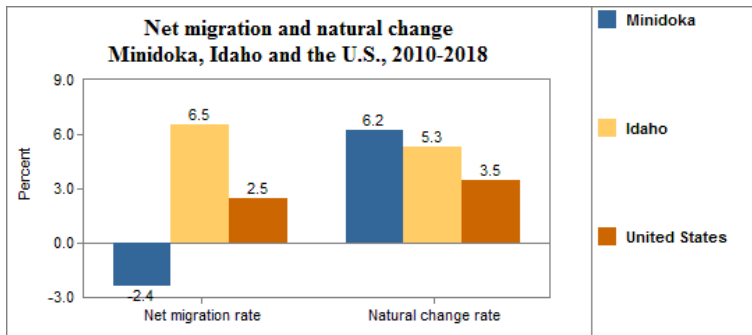


Population Change

- ◆ Minidoka Co. had 20,825 residents in 2018, 756 more than 2010.
- ◆ Population increased by 3.8 percent between 2010 and 2018, compared to an increase of 11.9 percent in Idaho as a whole.



- ◆ Minidoka County was the 23rd fastest growing county out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2010 and 2018.
- ◆ Since 1970, Minidoka County has gained 5,094 residents.
- ◆ Minidoka County had a migration rate below & natural change rate that was above the state average between 2010 and 2018.

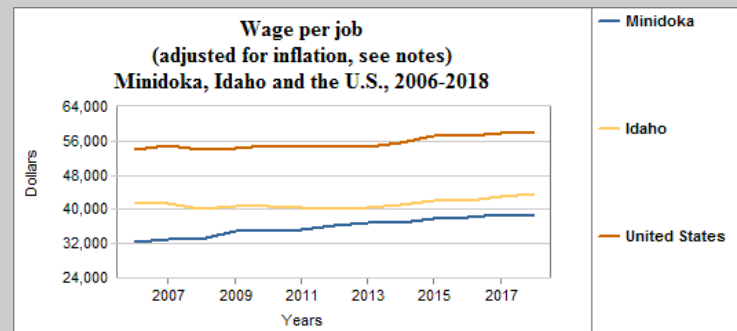


Employment

- ◆ The average annual unemployment rate in 2018 was 3.3%, compared to 2.8% for Idaho and 3.9% for the US. Minidoka County ranked 30th—from highest to lowest—out of Idaho's 44 counties.
- ◆ The largest number of jobs in 2018 were provided by farming, government, and manufacturing.
- ◆ The number of jobs was 11,133 in 2018, compared to 7,255 in 1969—a 53% increase.

- ◆ In 2018, the self-employment rate was 24.0%, compared to 25.7% for Idaho and 23.1% for the US.
- ◆ The average wage per job in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$38,625, up from \$32,979 a decade earlier. The average was \$43,659 in Idaho and \$58,304 in the US.



Social Trends

Educational Attainment

In Minidoka County on average between 2014-2018...

- ◆ 21.6% of the population 25 years and older had no high school diploma, compared to 9.4% in Idaho and 12.3% in the US.
- ◆ 13.4% had a bachelor's degree or higher, compared to 26.9% in Idaho and 31.5% in the US.

Poverty

- ◆ Minidoka County's overall poverty rate decreased from 13.4% in 2008 when the recession began to 12.4% in 2018.
- ◆ Statewide, the overall poverty rate in 2018 was 11.7% and the US rate was 13.1%.
- ◆ Minidoka County's child poverty rate (for people under 18) decreased from 18.7% in 2008 when the recession began to 15.9% in 2018.
- ◆ On average between 2014 and 2018, the poverty rate for people 65 and over was 10.3 percent.

Minidoka County Youth

- ◆ The teen birth rate in 2017 was 16 per 1,000, compared to 6 per 1,000 in Idaho and 8 per 1,000 in the US.
- ◆ On average between 2014 and 2018, teens who were not working, looking for work, and not in school made up 3.9% of all youth aged 16-19, compared to 6.8% in Idaho and 6.8% in the US.

Crime and Law Enforcement

In Minidoka County in 2018...

- ◆ The total number of crimes reported was 143 per 10,000 population, compared to 169 in Idaho and 258 in the US.
- ◆ The number of sworn police officers per 1,000 population was 1.8, compared to 1.6 in Idaho and 2.1 in the US.
