International Experience Grant

- \$150,000 available each year! Awardees must be U of I degree-seeking students who have not previously received an IEG, who are in good academic standing, and who are attending a U of I sanctioned education abroad program.
- Award amount: \$1,000. Awards given on a first-come, first-served basis once a U of I Education Abroad application is completed. There is no separate application to be considered for an IEG.

Erik Barnes Scholarship

- Awardees must be U of I degree-seeking students who are attending a program in China or Taiwan.
- Average awards: \$1,000. Preference given to students with financial need attending a yearlong program.
