Below is a list of items recommended by some of our Summer Design Week alums. **Watch out, though—you'll need a big suitcase to fit in everything on this list!** Please note: For each resident we provide a bed, desk, chair, closet, dresser and pillow, as well as bed linens, towels and one blanket. Additionally there is a microwave and a mini-fridge in each room.

What not to bring:

Don't bring everything you own. Definitely don't bring:

- A television or an air conditioner, because you won't be able to use them;
- Pets of any kind; or
- a motorcycle, scooter, or motorbike, none of which you are permitted to have on campus

Money:

Students frequently ask us how much spending money they should bring. This is really an individual decision. All your meals and most of your other activities are pre-paid as a separate cost of the program. The supply kit is included in the cost of the program. Neither the university nor anyone on the residence staff can hold money for you, and leaving it in your room or carrying a large amount of cash with you is not a great idea. We suggest that you use the ATMs located in Commons, Student Union Building, or the Campus Store. These ATMs have global access hookups. Or, you may want to talk with your home bank to get some suggestions for how to keep money on campus.
