## Divisions, Range Setup, Round Setup

- 1. Course of Fire/Age divisions (Age is as of January 1st of the year of event)
  - a. Junior (age 8-10) will shoot (6@15m, 6@20 m, 6@ 20 m, & 6@ 25 m).

Each Junior participant will shoot 1 end of 3 arrows at each yardage for practice (Each yardage practice shots will be shot prior to that yardage being shot for score); Each Junior participant will shoot 2 ends of 3 arrows each at 25m, 20m, 20m, 20m, for score; 4 ends for practice (12 arrows) and 8 ends for score (24 arrows).

b. Intermediate (age 11-13) will shoot (6@20 m, 6@ 25 m, 6@ 30 m & 6@ 35 m).

Each Intermediate participant will shoot 1 end of 3 arrows at each yardage for practice (Each yardage practice shots will be shot prior to that yardage being shot for score); Each intermediate participant will shoot 2 ends of 3 arrows each at 35m, 30m, 25m, & 20m for score; 4 ends for practice (12 arrows) and 8 ends for score (24 arrows).

c. Senior (age 14-18) will shoot (6@ 30 m, 6@ 35 m, 6@ 40 m, & 6@ 45 m).

Each Senior participant will shoot 1 end of 3 arrows at each yardage for practice (Each yardage practice shots will be shot prior to that yardage being shot for score); Each Senior participant will shoot 2 ends of 3 arrows each at 45m, 40m, 35m & 30m for score; 4 ends for practice (12 arrows) and 8 ends for score (24 arrows).

## 5. Field Round-21 arrows shot:

## Station #1:

Archers will shoot one arrow (total of 4 arrows) from each 20 yd. marker. Two left markers, left target. Two right markers, right target.

## Station #2:

Archers, at each yardage, shoot two arrows at the target (total of 4 arrows). Shoot from the longest yardage first, then move to the shortest. Juniors shoot from the 20 yd marker and then the 15 yd marker. Intermediates and Seniors shoot from the 25 yd marker and then the 20 yd marker.

#### Station #3:

Archers shoot one arrow at each target. You can start by shooting at the bottom target and going up or start at the top and go down. Only one arrow in each target. Each arrow will be shot from a different yardage. Starting at the longest yardage and moving closer with each shot. (25, 20, 15, & 10 feet total of 4 arrows)

#### Station #4

Archers will shoot two arrows from each yardage marker starting at the furthest yardage marker. Markers are labeled at 25 yards and 15 yards. (total of 4 arrows)

## Station #5

Archers, at each yardage, shoot two arrows at the target (total of 4 arrows). Shoot from the longest yardage first, then move to the shortest. Juniors shoot from the two closest markers. Intermediates and Seniors shoot from the two furthest markers. Yardages unknown.

## Station #6

Archers, at each yardage, shoot two arrows at the target (total of 4 arrows). Shoot from the longest yardage first, then move to the shortest. Juniors shoot from the 25 yd marker and then the 20 yd marker. Intermediates and Seniors shoot from the 30 yd marker and then the 25 yd marker.

## Station #7

Archers will shoot one arrow (total of 4 arrows) from each 30 yd. marker. Two left markers, left target. Two right markers, right target.

## Station #8

Archers shoot one arrow at each target. You can start by shooting at the bottom target and going up or start at the top and go down. Only one arrow in each target. Each arrow will be shot from a different yardage. Starting at the longest yardage and moving closer with each shot. (30, 25, 20, & 15 feet total of 4 arrows)

## Station #9

Archers, at each yardage, shoot two arrows at the target (total of 4 arrows). Shoot from the longest yardage first, then move to the shortest. Juniors shoot from the two closest markers. Intermediates and Seniors shoot from the two furthest markers. Yardages unknown.

## Station #10

Archers, at each yardage, shoot two arrows at the target (total of 4 arrows). Shoot from the longest yardage first, then move to the shortest. Juniors shoot from the two closest markers. Intermediates and Seniors shoot from the two furthest markers. Yardages unknown.

6. 3D Course- will include 10 stations of various animals. Yardages not marked.

- 1. Participants must be enrolled in the 4-H Shooting Sports Archery Program in the participant's home county.
- 2. By entry to this shooting event, the participant, parent, and leader is verifying that the youth has completed 5 hours of instruction, demonstrated basic safety, and possesses the basic knowledge and skills required. Any participant which, in the opinion of the range official, does not exhibit this basic knowledge and skills will have a brief safety and knowledge informal meeting before being allowed to continue.
- Each contestant must complete and turn in the individual registration/shooting sports waiver
  form and appropriate registration fees to the Extension staff person in
  time to meet the deadline. In most cases this will be done through the County
  Coordinator.
- 4. Each contestant must also meet any and all other requirements set by the State Shooting Sports Advisory Committee, any other requirements set forth by their County for eligibility to compete in contests/events, and any requirements of the State 4-H program for participation in events. To participate the member must be recognized by their county as a member in good standing.
- SAFETY IS ALWAYS THE PRIMARY CONSIDERATION. Any violations of accepted safety rules are grounds for immediate disqualification. NO WARNING REQUIRED! Each contestant, parent, or coach will follow these rules.
- Eye Protection: Shooting glasses or equivalent prescription glasses are strongly recommended (but not required) for archery events. ISU or UIT glasses may be worn only if both eyes are adequately protected.
- Ear Protection: Such equipment may be used in archery events if the shooter desires. Archery does not require hearing protection.
- Cased Requirement: All bows and arrows must be in a bow rack, bow bag, & or
  quiver at all times except when on the range and ready to participate in the event.
- Audio headphones or ear pieces and cell phones are not permitted on the
  firing line or the field. Once an individual is called to compete, earpieces,
  or headphones must be removed and remain off during the competition.
  Spectators should also be sensitive and turn off ringtones when near the
  competition.
- 10. Range officials have the right to check all archery equipment prior to its use in competition to determine that it meets qualifications and/or that it is safe. Unsafe equipment will not be allowed on the range.
- 11. Contestants are responsible for the care of their equipment that they use during the competition, including the possible use of safety glasses and/or ear protection. Targets, score cards, and other range equipment will be provided.
- 12. Three competition age classes or divisions are recognized. Participants must compete within their own age group per specified age range. Age is as of January 1 of the current year of the event.

a. JUNIOR: Ages 8-10

b. INTERMEDIATE: Ages 11-13

- 13. There will be on-site registration on day of contest. It will be at an increased fee from the pre-registration fees. The name tag serves as the primary registration document. Name tags must be worn during competitive events. Check in with the Registration staff on site to obtaining your name tag.
- 14. When the contest official begins no further contestants will be accepted.
- 15. Contestants should be present at least 20 minutes prior to scheduled shooting time. If not present when called – that slot will be filled with another shooter. You may or may not be rescheduled, at the discretion of the Range Officer in charge.
- 16. Range Officer will accompany a registered shooter to the shooting line in competition. Their primary responsibility will be to assure that safety rules are always followed. The Range Officer may assist the shooter within the guidelines listed below:
  - a. May physically assist the shooters between relays and during the sight-in period
    - b. Load if needed (particularly "junior age division" shooters)
    - c. Verbally assist only the shooters during the actual firing.
- 17. Disabilities/Special Needs In the event that any participant is physically incapable of complying with the general rules or specified discipline rules, the event staff will make every reasonable effort to accommodate that individual, allowing them to compete.
- 18. Any accommodation made must not jeopardize range safety.
- 19. Specific arrangements must be made and approved prior to the beginning of the competition with the Competition Coordinator. The Chief Range Officer must also be notified prior to beginning of the participant's shoot.
- 20. Scoring for the event will be done by the archery shooters themselves and will be overseen by the Range Officers. After targets are scored, youth shooters may review and retrieve arrows with the permission of the Range Officer. Scores will be tabulated at the completions of each shooting round. After the shoot is completed the Coordinator and helpers will tabulate scores and results. Please leave scoring personnel alone so scores can be posted as soon as possible.
- 21. Appeals/challenges

Scoring - Competitors only (not adults) may challenge their score in this event. The first appeal is to be registered with the Range Officer within 30 minutes of the round or end that the scores were taken from. The second appeal, if necessary, will be registered with the Competition Coordinator and county adult leader. The Range Officer will be involved. The third appeal will be registered with the Hosting 4-H Coordinator of the match. No scoring challenges are allowed after arrows have been pulled unless at the specified request of the range official.

22. Spectator Interference: Disruption by parents, coaches or other individuals will not be permitted. Sanctions ranging from a warning to ejection from the grounds or disqualification of an individual will be imposed for interference with the operation of the match or disruption of the events on a firing line or field. The "Little League Syndrome" will not be tolerated in 4-H Shooting Sports. Every effort will be made to keep these events fair, kid-centered and positive.

- 23. Coach Removal: The shoot management reserves the right to remove any coach from the firing line in the event that his or her behavior is deemed detrimental or distracting to their own shooter or others. Coaches should remain positive and supportive being careful not to disrupt other shooters. In the event that a coach is removed from the firing line, another coach may substitute for him/her at the discretion of the range officer.
- 24. Alcohol Policy: No alcoholic beverages may be consumed on the grounds during this event. Violation of this policy is ground for ejection from the premises.
- 25. Dress Code: Participants are expected to dress appropriately. No open toed shoes will be permitted. Club uniforms or shirts with the use of the 4-H logo are encouraged, but not required. Both young people and adults should wear attire appropriate for the weather while remaining modest and socially acceptable. All shooters and coaches should remember that they may be having photographs taken or be asked to interview for the media. Remember that you represent all of 4-H Shooting Sports Make it a positive image. Clothing with alcohol or tobacco advertisements or sexual connotations, etc. are prohibited.
