<u>2014 Pacific Northwest Weed Management Handbook</u>	Designed as a quick and ready reference for weed control practices and herbicides used in various cropping systems or sites in Idaho, Oregon, and Washington.
<u>Idaho's Noxious Weeds - 2011 Control Guidelines</u>	Lists specific herbicides and biological control agents for each weed on Idaho's official noxious weeds list.
<u>Idaho's Noxious Weeds-6th edition</u>	See color photographs of all 65 weeds on Idaho's official noxious weeds list. Also included are maps showing each weed's distribution by county, leaf shape illustrations to aid in identification, and features to help distinguish the weeds from similar-looking plants.
<u>Puncturevine</u>	A member of the Caltrop family, this weed produces woody fruits that always land with one sharp spine pointed upward. Spines injure hooves, feet, and vehicle tires. A toxin from the plant may be linked to photosensitization in sheep, leading to bighead. Cultural and biological controls are discussed.
