Bonner County Fair Requirements:

Poultry will not be weighed but members should strive to meet the following age and weight suggestions. It is also encouraged that members not select intact males as their exhibit animals, as they are prone to more behavioral issues when around unfamiliar animals.

- Chickens: should be less than 8 weeks old and around 4-6 lbs. each •
- Turkeys: Hens should be around 16 weeks old and around 12-16 lbs each, Toms should be less than 25 weeks old ٠ and around 20-30 lbs.

As per State Department of Agriculture Recommendation, waterfowl will not be allowed for fair exhibition. All poultry must be tested for Avian influenza before exhibiting at fair. Please contact the Extension Office prior to animal purchase for the most current information.
