We couldn't be more excited to see 4-H events coming back in full swing! Members are headed off to a variety of trips to learn new skills. All of these trips can add up cost wise, so let's spend a little bit of time on available travel scholarships that will cut those bills down to manageable amounts for your family.

- Canyon County 4-H Council Scholarship – The Canyon County Leaders' Council budgets scholarship dollars for many learning activities: 4-H Ambassadors, Know Your Government, Camp Councilors, State Teen Association Convention, Horse Camp, 4-H Adventure Camp, special events and more! Scholarships are not need based. Check out the application for specifics on available funds. Please note that youth and adults who receive funds are asked to volunteer with a local event sometime after their trip. - John H. Thiessen Scholarship – This scholarship is for adult volunteers attending a 4-H leadership opportunity. Scholarship amounts vary based on availability. The application can be found at: <https://www.uidaho.edu/extension/4h/volunteers/events>
- Doris Roper Scholarship – This youth scholarship also helps youth participate in leadership opportunities that they otherwise cannot afford. It is a needs-based scholarship. The application is available at: <https://www.uidaho.edu/extension/4h/volunteers/events>
- State 4-H Travel Scholarships – As funds are available, the Idaho 4-H State Office advertises travel scholarships for State 4-H events. These are typically advertised through social media and in the Friday email. An example of a current scholarship is an available STAC travel scholarship. There are currently 52 - \$100 scholarships and 8-Full scholarships for STAC.

The money for these scholarships come from a variety of places. The Canyon County 4-H Council Scholarships are funded by the Snake River Stampede Concessions and the Canyon County 4-H Endowment. State funds are provided by various donors, including the Thiessen family and Tractor Supply Company.

In general, it is okay to apply for multiple scholarships for one event, but you do not want to over scholarship. This means that you should communicate with those giving the scholarships to you and you should only accept the total amount needed to attend the learning opportunity.
