<p>Youth Materials: ZSuites record book</p> <p>Youth need to have office approval of project before project is started. Safety aspects for age group must be taken into account.</p> <p>Note to project leader/parents: Youth are allowed to have assistance from an adult mentor on this project on an 80/20 basis, 80-100% of the work completed by the youth with no more than 20% done by an adult's emphasis on safety. 75% of project needs to be from recycled materials.</p> <p>All age levels should have adult supervision.
