Final Fair Enrollment for 2021: Friday May 7, 2021

There will be an \$8.00 per specie fee which is non-refundable due at registration.

All enrollments for animals are due one week before initial weigh-in. Turkey's, Rabbits & Goats are due May 7, 2021.

Horse project record books due by August 2, 2021 by 4 PM.

All livestock project record books due by August 4, 2021 by 4 PM (dairy must include fertility exam & bangs vaccination receipt in record book & turkey must turn in tri-fold)

Enrollment Deadline: Friday, March 5, 2021

Livestock Agreements & Bills of Sale/Idaho Brand Inspection: Due by March 5, 2021

Beg. Weigh-in Date: Saturday, March 13, 2021, Burley Livestock Auction Yard 7-8:30 AM

Beg. Weigh-in Requirements: Maximum weight 1,000 lbs.

Fair Weigh-in requirements: no minimum, ADG: Holsteins 1.60 lbs., Jersey 1.25 lbs. & Crossbred 1.40 lbs.

Beg. Weigh-in Requirements: No minimum or maximum (suggested 70-100 lbs, scrapie tags must be
in place for all market sheep projects)
