

Frank Rodgers Livestock College Scholarship

Purpose: The Southern Idaho Livestock Judging Camp will offer up to three (3) college scholarships in the amounts of \$1000, \$700 and \$500 to assist livestock youth members with post-high school education. Scholarship funding depends on funds available.

Eligibility: Applicants must have been involved in livestock projects and attended at least three (3) Southern Idaho Livestock Judging Camps. Applicants must be between the ages of 15 and 19 and plan to attend some form of higher education; university, college, technical or trade school. Proof of enrollment must be provided before receiving scholarship. Applicants can only receive one scholarship.

Selection Process: Applications will be evaluated on the basis of the six criteria listed below.

Due Date: Applications (including high school transcripts) must be postmarked by July 1.

Application Instructions

Information Required as Part of Your Application. To be considered as a scholarship candidate, you must include the following items in your application in this order:

- The seven-page application form filled out.
- High school transcript.
- One letter of recommendation from a school advisor, FFA advisor, 4-H Leader or Extension Educator (someone who knows your involvement but is not a close relative).

Submit one original copy in a clear report cover and five complete copies stapled in the upper left hand corner.

How Applications will be scored

Section 1 Academic Achievements (10 points) 10%
As indicated by grade-point average, and ACT/SAT scores.

Section 2 FFA, 4-H and Other Agricultural Organization Activities and Involvement (40 points) 40%
As shown by scope of honors, accomplishments, variety and level of participation in activities, and breadth of leadership experiences.

Section 3 Other School Organizations (10 points) 10%
As shown by membership, involvement and leadership experiences.

Section 4 Community, Civic and Church Activities (10 points) 10%
As evidenced by membership, involvement and leadership experiences including examples of how others were helped.

Section 5 Leadership and Future Plans (20 points) 20%
As described by listing of career goals and ambitions for the future.

Section 6 General Effect (10 points) 10%
As evidenced by photos and clippings representative of applicant, their projects and activities.



