Now is the time to pay your dues! All members and leaders must be enrolled and **active** in 4-H Online in order to participate in 4-H project meetings or events.

If your 4-H Online account is still in **'pending'** status, this most likely means you have re-enrolled in the current 4-H year, either as a youth or volunteer/leader, but have not yet paid your dues.

Updates and information is primarily targeted by project, so please make sure you are signed up for the correct project(s). If you are not sure how to sign up for projects or want to review your current projects, come by the Extension office and our staff will assist you.

Weigh-in and tagging for sheep and goats will take place on July 1 at the Latah County Fairgrounds from 3:00 pm—7:00 pm. Martin Dibble will be available for shearing beginning at 1:00 pm at \$7.00/head. Vaccines will be available. A postcard reminder will be sent to families in June.


REGISTER NOW FOR CL2N 4-H CAMP


