Enrollments received after April 15 are not eligible to participate in the live horse project.

Any enrolled horse project that dies or becomes unusable within the first half of the ownership/leasing period may be replaced upon verification by the County Extension Office. Members must contact the Extension Office immediately upon the death or un-usability of their horse and will have 7 working days to replace the horse. Replacement horses are not eligible for High Point or the Overall Horse award.
