

# 2017 CLASS REGISTRATION – Part 1

**Parents and/or Leaders: Please read this carefully with your 4-Her so that each participant is in the class best fit to their needs!**

All 4-H members must register for the classes they want. Included is a class listing. Nearly all of the classes are directly related to the 4-H horse project materials and are organized accordingly. Some classes are offered by experience level and meet more than once. Please select the classes that best fit your needs after carefully reading the class descriptions in the registration information booklet.

Classes will be filled on a first-come, first-serve basis. Should a class you have selected be filled, we will first try to alter your schedule so you will be in the classes you have selected. If we are unable to get your first choices we will fall back to your alternates. If that fails, we will give priority to your Horsemanship classes after which there may be blanks in your schedule. During these “blanks” feel free to attend any non-horse (NH) class or you may watch the horsemanship classes from the sidelines.

Please select a total of (15) fifteen classes by making a check in the box next to the class. (NOTE: Three Part Classes take 3 of your choices, Two Part Classes take 2.) After you have selected your fifteen classes select at least two alternates by writing the letter “A” in the box.

**ADULTS:** Please attend the horseback riding classes with your child as an observer only. Adults will not be allowed to enter or ride their horses in any classes. There are numerous “no horse” (NH) classes that you are encouraged to attend. Pick up a schedule of these classes at registration. (Remember our lecture classes are presented by volunteers and sometimes their schedule does not allow them to attend camp. Lecture classes can be cancelled at any time.) You do not need to fill out this form. Once you get to camp and know what your kids’ schedule is, you are free to pick and choose the classes you wish to observe.

The instructors will have the responsibility to remove any student from their class if they feel your child or other students’ safety is in jeopardy. Adjustment of the schedule will be completed as soon as possible to allow that child the most class time in a safe environment. The instructors have also been instructed to excuse any student that is being disrespectful or disruptive during training sessions. The safety of your children is our first concern; teaching them is our second.
