Forestry Cost Sharing

Most Idaho forests will be healthier and more likely to meet landowners' objectives with some stand treatments, such as pre-commercial thinning and tree planting.

Many forest owners do this work themselves, but for people who have large numbers of acres to treat, it is often essential to hire some help to do the work. In addition to labor, many treatments also require financial resources to pay for tree seedlings, stream crossing structures, etc.

Most of the treatments that family forest owners make have public benefits, such as reduced fire risk. So, public and non-governmental organizations often make financial assistance available to support forest improvements. This program is designed to answer forest owners' most common questions about these programs and help them apply for them.
