

How to Use Alcohol-Based Hand Rub







How to Use Alcohol-Based Hand Rub Apply rub to the palm of one hand. Rub hands together until dry. Make sure to cover all surfaces of hands and fingers. Do not use water with the rub. The alcohol in the rub kills germs that cause illness. The amount of product needed depends on the type of rub used. Alcohol-based hand rubs work well against many, but not all bacteria.
