
Housing

- ♦ The median value of owner-occupied housing (adjusted for inflation) was \$155,263 between 2014 and 2018, compared to \$195,784 in Idaho and \$208,613 in the US.
- ◆ The median value was the 28th highest out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2014 and 2018.
- ♦ The number of housing units increased by 17.0% from 2000 to 2018, compared to an increase of 34.8% in Idaho.




Income

- ◆ The county's per capita income in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$38,851, compared to the state average of \$44,696 and the national average of \$55,433.
- ◆ Per capita income increased by 11.4% from 2008 to 2018, compared to an increase of 15.3% in Idaho and an increase of 14.1% in the US.
- The median household income (adjusted for inflation) was \$52,230 in 2018 compared to \$56,530 in Idaho and \$63,059 in the US.



Hispanic Population

Bannock County had 7,647 Hispanic residents in 2018.



Age Structure

- ♦ 26.2% of Bannock County's population was under 18 in 2018, in contrast to 25.5% in Idaho and 22.4% in the US.
- ♦ In 2018, 59.5% of the population was 18 to 64 years old, compared to 58.7% in Idaho and 61.5% in the US.
- ♦ Bannock County's median age in 2018 was 34.0 compared to 36.6 in Idaho and 38.2 in the US.

Note: The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of inflation. Using the CPI to put dollar values in "real" terms makes it easier to see "inflation-free" change over time. Our base year is 2019, which means all dollar values are in terms of 2019 dollars.


COUNTY HIGHLIGHTS

- ◆ Bannock County's total population in 2018 was 87,138.
- ♦ In 2018, the median household income was \$52,230.
- ◆ Bannock County's average annual unemployment rate was 2.7% in 2018.
- ♦ In 2018, Hispanic residents made up 8.8% of the population, compared to 12.7% in Idaho and 18.3% in the US.




Population Change

- ♦ Bannock Co. had 87,138 residents in 2018, 4,299 more than 2010.
- ♦ Population grew by 5.2 percent between 2010 and 2018, compared to an increase of 11.9 percent in Idaho as a whole.



- Bannock County was the 18th fastest growing county out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2010 and 2018.
- Since 1970, Bannock County has gained 34,938 residents.
- ♦ Bannock County had a migration rate below & natural change rate that was above the state average between 2010 and 2018.




Employment

- The average annual unemployment rate in 2018 was 2.7%, compared to 2.8% for Idaho and 3.9% for the US. Bannock County ranked 27th—from highest to lowest—out of Idaho's 44 counties.
- ♦ The largest number of jobs in 2018 were provided by government, health care & social assistance, and retail trade.
- ♦ The number of jobs was 47,833 in 2018, compared to 20,200 in 1969—a 137% increase.

- ♦ In 2018, the self-employment rate was 21.8%, compared to 25.7% for Idaho and 23.1% for the US.
- ♦ The average wage per job in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$37,577, up slightly from \$36,239 a decade earlier. The average was \$43,659 in Idaho and \$58,304 in the US.



Social Trends

Educational Attainment

In Bannock County on average between 2014-2018...

- ♦ 8.1% of the population 25 years and older had no high school diploma, compared to 9.4% in Idaho and 12.3% in the US.
- ◆ 27.2% had a bachelor's degree or higher, compared to 26.9% in Idaho and 31.5% in the US.

Poverty

- ◆ Bannock County's overall poverty rate decreased from 14.1% in 2008 when the recession began to 13.8% in 2018.
- Statewide, the overall poverty rate in 2018 was 11.7% and the US rate was 13.1%.
- Bannock County's child poverty rate (for people under 18) decreased from 26.2% in 2008 when the recession began to 15.5% in 2018.
- ♦ On average between 2014 and 2018, the poverty rate for people 65 and over was 8.2 percent.

Bannock County Youth

- ♦ The teen birth rate in 2017 was 4 per 1,000, compared to 6 per 1,000 in Idaho and 8 per 1,000 in the US.
- On average between 2014 and 2018, teens who were not working, looking for work, and not in school made up 5.9% of all youth aged 16-19, compared to 6.8% in Idaho and 6.8% in the US.

Crime and Law Enforcement

In Bannock County in 2018...

- ◆ The total number of crimes reported was 293 per 10,000 population, compared to 169 in Idaho and 258 in the US.
- ♦ The number of sworn police officers per 1,000 population was 1.8, compared to 1.6 in Idaho and 2.1 in the US.
