



Housing

- ◆ The median value of owner-occupied housing (adjusted for inflation) was \$139,686 between 2014 and 2018, compared to \$195,784 in Idaho and \$208,613 in the US.
- ◆ The median value was the 37th highest out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2014 and 2018.
- ◆ The number of housing units increased by 3.1% from 2000 to 2018, compared to an increase of 34.8% in Idaho.




Income

- ◆ The county's per capita income in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$39,855, compared to the state average of \$44,696 and the national average of \$55,433.
- ◆ Per capita income increased by 0.6% from 2008 to 2018, compared to an increase of 15.3% in Idaho and an increase of 14.1% in the US.
- ◆ The median household income (adjusted for inflation) was \$62,328 in 2018 compared to \$56,530 in Idaho and \$63,059 in the US.



Hispanic Population

- ◆ Caribou County had 401 Hispanic residents in 2018.



Age Structure

- ◆ 28.6% of Caribou County's population was under 18 in 2018, in contrast to 25.5% in Idaho and 22.4% in the US.
- ◆ In 2018, 53.9% of the population was 18 to 64 years old, compared to 58.7% in Idaho and 61.5% in the US.
- ◆ Caribou County's median age in 2018 was 37.3 compared to 36.6 in Idaho and 38.2 in the US.

Note: The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of inflation. Using the CPI to put dollar values in "real" terms makes it easier to see "inflation-free" change over time. 



COUNTY HIGHLIGHTS

- ◆ Caribou County's total population in 2018 was 7,060.
- ◆ In 2018, the median household income was \$62,328.
- ◆ Caribou County's average annual unemployment rate was 2.8% in 2018.
- ◆ In 2018, Hispanic residents made up 5.7% of the population, compared to 12.7% in Idaho and 18.3% in the US.




Population Change

- ◆ Caribou County had 7,060 residents in 2018, 97 more than 2010.
- ◆ Population increased by 1.4 percent between 2010 and 2018, compared to an increase of 11.9 percent in Idaho as a whole.



- ◆ Caribou County was the 28th fastest growing county out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2010 and 2018.
- ◆ Since 1970, Caribou County has gained 526 residents.
- ◆ Caribou County had migration & natural change rates that were below the state average between 2010 and 2018.




Employment

- ◆ The average annual unemployment rate in 2018 was 2.8%, compared to 2.8% for Idaho and 3.9% for the US. Caribou County ranked 25th—from highest to lowest—out of Idaho's 44 counties.
- ◆ The largest number of jobs in 2018 were provided by manufacturing, government, and farming.
- ◆ The number of jobs was 4,836 in 2018, compared to 3,133 in 1969—a 54% increase.

- ◆ In 2018, the self-employment rate was 26.1%, compared to 25.7% for Idaho and 23.1% for the US.
- ◆ The average wage per job in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$55,442, up from \$49,918 a decade earlier. The average was \$43,659 in Idaho and \$58,304 in the US.



Social Trends

Educational Attainment

In Caribou County on average between 2014-2018...

- ◆ 7.8% of the population 25 years and older had no high school diploma, compared to 9.4% in Idaho and 12.3% in the US.
- ◆ 19.9% had a bachelor's degree or higher, compared to 26.9% in Idaho and 31.5% in the US.

Poverty

- ◆ Caribou County's overall poverty rate decreased from 10.9% in 2008 when the recession began to 8.9% in 2018.
- ◆ Statewide, the overall poverty rate in 2018 was 11.7% and the US rate was 13.1%.
- ◆ Caribou County's child poverty rate (for people under 18) decreased from 15.6% in 2008 when the recession began to 11.5% in 2018.
- ◆ On average between 2014 and 2018, the poverty rate for people 65 and over was 10.9 percent.

Caribou County Youth

- ◆ The teen birth rate in 2017 was NA per 1,000, compared to 6 per 1,000 in Idaho and 8 per 1,000 in the US.
- ◆ On average between 2014 and 2018, teens who were not working, looking for work, and not in school made up 2.7% of all youth aged 16-19, compared to 6.8% in Idaho and 6.8% in the US.

Crime and Law Enforcement

In Caribou County in 2018...

- ◆ The total number of crimes reported was 52 per 10,000 population, compared to 169 in Idaho and 258 in the US.
- ◆ The number of sworn police officers per 1,000 population was 1.7, compared to 1.6 in Idaho and 2.1 in the US.
