



Housing

- ◆ The median value of owner-occupied housing (adjusted for inflation) was \$217,470 between 2014 and 2018, compared to \$195,784 in Idaho and \$208,613 in the US.
- ◆ The median value was the 7th highest out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2014 and 2018.
- ◆ The number of housing units increased by 21.3% from 2000 to 2018, compared to an increase of 34.8% in Idaho.




Income

- ◆ The county's per capita income in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$42,090, compared to the state average of \$44,696 and the national average of \$55,433.
- ◆ Per capita income increased by 12.5% from 2008 to 2018, compared to an increase of 15.3% in Idaho and an increase of 14.1% in the US.
- ◆ The median household income (adjusted for inflation) was \$50,436 in 2018 compared to \$56,530 in Idaho and \$63,059 in the US.



Hispanic Population

- ◆ Latah County had 1,803 Hispanic residents in 2018.



Age Structure

- ◆ 19.0% of Latah County's population was under 18 in 2018, in contrast to 25.5% in Idaho and 22.4% in the US.
- ◆ In 2018, 67.5% of the population was 18 to 64 years old, compared to 58.7% in Idaho and 61.5% in the US.
- ◆ Latah County's median age in 2018 was 29.2 compared to 36.6 in Idaho and 38.2 in the US.

Note: The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of inflation. Using the CPI to put dollar values in "real" terms makes it easier to see "inflation-free" change over time. 



COUNTY HIGHLIGHTS

- ◆ Latah County's total population in 2018 was 40,134.
- ◆ In 2018, the median household income was \$50,436.
- ◆ Latah County's average annual unemployment rate was 2.5% in 2018.
- ◆ In 2018, Hispanic residents made up 4.5% of the population, compared to 12.7% in Idaho and 18.3% in the US.




Population Change

- ◆ Latah County had 40,134 residents in 2018, 2,890 more than 2010.
- ◆ Population increased by 7.8 percent between 2010 and 2018, compared to an increase of 11.9 percent in Idaho as a whole.



- ◆ Latah County was the 12th fastest growing county out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2010 and 2018.
- ◆ Since 1970, Latah County has gained 15,236 residents.
- ◆ Latah County had migration & natural change rates that were below the state average between 2010 and 2018.




Employment

- ◆ The average annual unemployment rate in 2018 was 2.5%, compared to 2.8% for Idaho and 3.9% for the US. Latah County ranked 33rd—from highest to lowest—out of Idaho's 44 counties.
- ◆ The largest number of jobs in 2018 were provided by government, retail trade, and accommodation and food services.
- ◆ The number of jobs was 22,809 in 2018, compared to 9,124 in 1969—a 150% increase.

- ◆ In 2018, the self-employment rate was 27.2%, compared to 25.7% for Idaho and 23.1% for the US.
- ◆ The average wage per job in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$37,962, up from \$34,742 a decade earlier. The average was \$43,659 in Idaho and \$58,304 in the US.



Social Trends

Educational Attainment

In Latah County on average between 2014-2018...

- ◆ 3.7% of the population 25 years and older had no high school diploma, compared to 9.4% in Idaho and 12.3% in the US.
- ◆ 45.1% had a bachelor's degree or higher, compared to 26.9% in Idaho and 31.5% in the US.

Poverty

- ◆ Latah County's overall poverty rate decreased from 20.7% in 2008 when the recession began to 12.7% in 2018.
- ◆ Statewide, the overall poverty rate in 2018 was 11.7% and the US rate was 13.1%.
- ◆ Latah County's child poverty rate (for people under 18) decreased from 15.2% in 2008 when the recession began to 10.2% in 2018.
- ◆ On average between 2014 and 2018, the poverty rate for people 65 and over was 7.4 percent.

Latah County Youth

- ◆ The teen birth rate in 2017 was 2 per 1,000, compared to 6 per 1,000 in Idaho and 8 per 1,000 in the US.
- ◆ On average between 2014 and 2018, teens who were not working, looking for work, and not in school made up 2.7% of all youth aged 16-19, compared to 6.8% in Idaho and 6.8% in the US.

Crime and Law Enforcement

In Latah County in 2018...

- ◆ The total number of crimes reported was 137 per 10,000 population, compared to 169 in Idaho and 258 in the US.
- ◆ The number of sworn police officers per 1,000 population was 1.5, compared to 1.6 in Idaho and 2.1 in the US.
