



Housing

- ◆ The median value of owner-occupied housing (adjusted for inflation) was \$125,229 between 2014 and 2018, compared to \$195,784 in Idaho and \$208,613 in the US.
- ◆ The median value was the 42nd highest out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2014 and 2018.
- ◆ The number of housing units increased by 6.8% from 2000 to 2018, compared to an increase of 34.8% in Idaho.




Income

- ◆ The county's per capita income in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$48,123, compared to the state average of \$44,696 and the national average of \$55,433.
- ◆ Per capita income decreased by 0.2% from 2008 to 2018, compared to an increase of 15.3% in Idaho and an increase of 14.1% in the US.
- ◆ The median household income (adjusted for inflation) was \$45,725 in 2018 compared to \$56,530 in Idaho and \$63,059 in the US.



Hispanic Population

- ◆ Lewis County had 180 Hispanic residents in 2018.



Age Structure

- ◆ 22.6% of Lewis County's population was under 18 in 2018, in contrast to 25.5% in Idaho and 22.4% in the US.
- ◆ In 2018, 51.0% of the population was 18 to 64 years old, compared to 58.7% in Idaho and 61.5% in the US.
- ◆ Lewis County's median age in 2018 was 48.6 compared to 36.6 in Idaho and 38.2 in the US.

Note: The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of inflation. Using the CPI to put dollar values in "real" terms makes it easier to see "inflation-free" change over time. 

COUNTY HIGHLIGHTS

- ◆ Lewis County's total population in 2018 was 3,861.
- ◆ In 2018, the median household income was \$45,725.
- ◆ Lewis County's average annual unemployment rate was 5.5% in 2018.
- ◆ In 2018, Hispanic residents made up 4.7% of the population, compared to 12.7% in Idaho and 18.3% in the US.




Population Change

- ◆ Lewis County had 3,821 residents in 2018, 40 more than 2010.
- ◆ Population increased by 1.0 percent between 2010 and 2018, compared to an increase of 11.9 percent in Idaho as a whole.



- ◆ Lewis County was the 31st fastest growing county out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2010 and 2018.
- ◆ Since 1970, Lewis County has lost 6 residents.
- ◆ Lewis County had migration & natural change rates that were below the state average between 2010 and 2018.




Employment

- ◆ The average annual unemployment rate in 2018 was 5.5%, compared to 2.8% for Idaho and 3.9% for the US. Lewis County ranked 4th—from highest to lowest—out of Idaho's 44 counties.
- ◆ The largest number of jobs in 2018 were provided by government, manufacturing, and farming.
- ◆ The number of jobs was 2,752 in 2018, compared to 1,756 in 1969—a 57% increase.

- ◆ In 2018, the self-employment rate was 34.6%, compared to 25.7% for Idaho and 23.1% for the US.
- ◆ The average wage per job in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$32,533, up from \$28,846 a decade earlier. The average was \$43,659 in Idaho and \$58,304 in the US.



Social Trends

Educational Attainment

In Lewis County on average between 2014-2018...

- ◆ 11.5% of the population 25 years and older had no high school diploma, compared to 9.4% in Idaho and 12.3% in the US.
- ◆ 17.3% had a bachelor's degree or higher, compared to 26.9% in Idaho and 31.5% in the US.

Poverty

- ◆ Lewis County's overall poverty rate fluctuated yet remained the same from 14.2% in 2008 when the recession began to 14.2% in 2018.
- ◆ Statewide, the overall poverty rate in 2018 was 11.7% and the US rate was 13.1%.
- ◆ Lewis County's child poverty rate (for people under 18) decreased from 24.0% in 2008 when the recession began to 23.3% in 2018.
- ◆ On average between 2014 and 2018, the poverty rate for people 65 and over was 9.3 percent.

Lewis County Youth

- ◆ The teen birth rate in 2015 was 29 per 1,000, compared to 9 per 1,000 in Idaho and 10 per 1,000 in the US.
- ◆ On average between 2014 and 2018, teens who were not working, looking for work, and not in school made up 23.2% of all youth aged 16-19, compared to 6.8% in Idaho and 6.8% in the US.

Crime and Law Enforcement

In Lewis County in 2017...

- ◆ The total number of crimes reported was 82 per 10,000 population, compared to 186 in Idaho and 236 in the US.
- ◆ The number of sworn police officers per 1,000 population was 2.1, compared to 1.7 in Idaho and 2.1 in the US.
