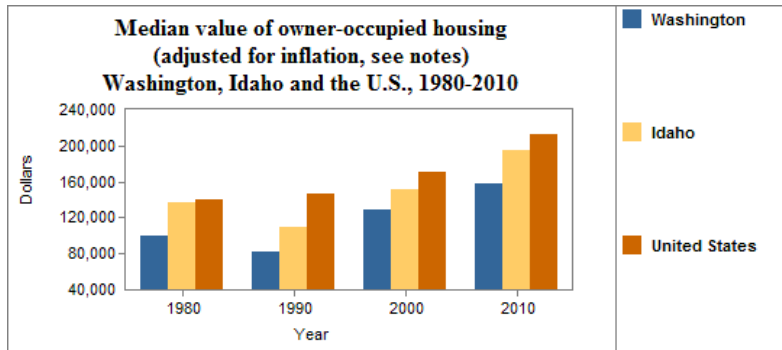


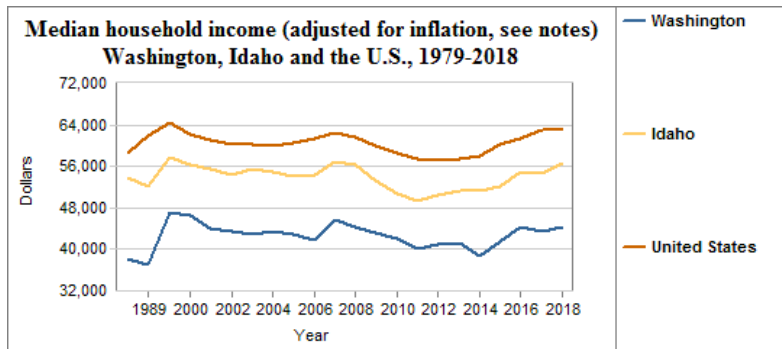
Housing

- ◆ The median value of owner-occupied housing (adjusted for inflation) was \$154,958 between 2014 and 2018, compared to \$195,874 in Idaho and \$208,613 in the US.
- ◆ The median value was the 29th highest out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2014 and 2018.
- ◆ The number of housing units increased by 11.9% from 2000 to 2018, compared to an increase of 34.8% in Idaho.



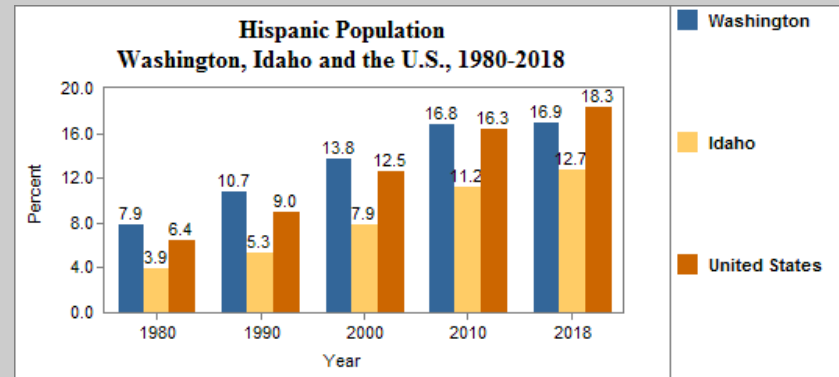
Income

- ◆ The county's per capita income in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$36,881, compared to the state average of \$44,696 and the national average of \$55,433.
- ◆ Per capita income increased by 6.4% from 2008 to 2018, compared to an increase of 15.3% in Idaho and an increase of 14.1% in the US.
- ◆ The median household income (adjusted for inflation) was \$44,188 in 2018 compared to \$56,530 in Idaho and \$63,059 in the US.



Hispanic Population

- ◆ Washington County had 1,718 Hispanic residents in 2018.



Age Structure

- ◆ 22.7% of Washington County's population was under 18 in 2018, in contrast to 25.5% in Idaho and 22.4% in the US.
- ◆ In 2018, 52.2% of the population was 18 to 64 years old, compared to 58.7% in Idaho and 61.5% in the US.
- ◆ Washington County's median age in 2018 was 46.1 compared to 36.6 in Idaho and 38.2 in the US.

Note: The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of inflation. Using the CPI to put dollar values in "real" terms makes it easier to see "inflation-free" change over time. 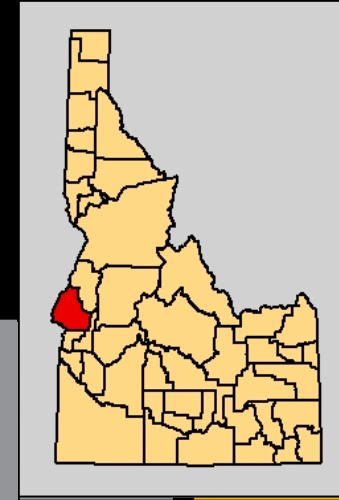

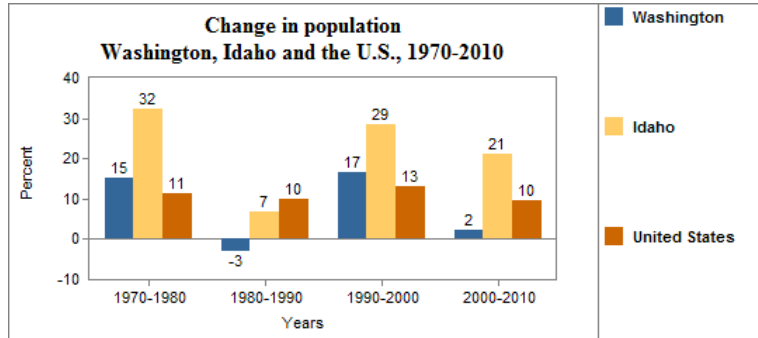
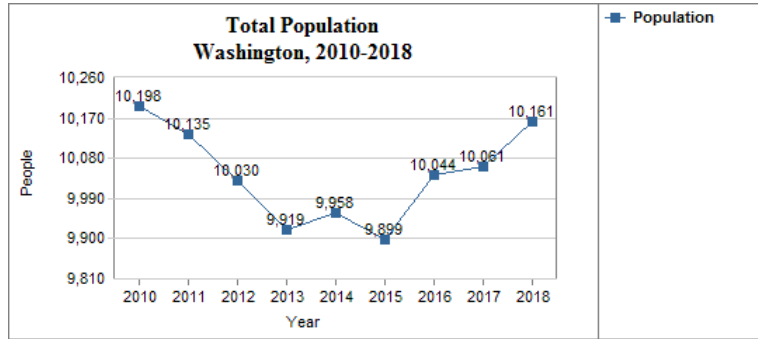
COUNTY HIGHLIGHTS

- ◆ Washington County's total population in 2018 was 10,161.
- ◆ In 2018, the median household income was \$44,188.
- ◆ Washington County's average annual unemployment rate was 4.1% in 2018.
- ◆ In 2018, Hispanic residents made up 16.9% of the population, compared to 12.7% in Idaho and 18.3% in the US.

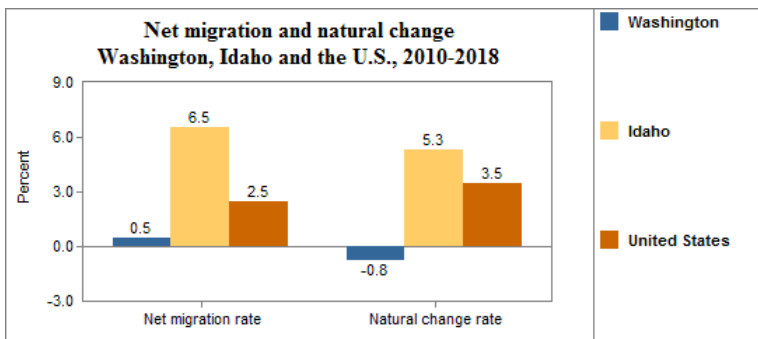


Population Change

- Washington Co. had 10,161 residents in 2018, 37 less than 2010.
- Population decreased by 0.4 percent between 2010 and 2018, compared to an increase of 11.9 percent in Idaho as a whole.



- Washington County was the 37th fastest growing county out of Idaho's 44 counties between 2010 and 2018.
- Since 1970, Washington County has gained 2,528 residents.
- Washington County had migration & natural change rates that were below the state average between 2010 and 2018.

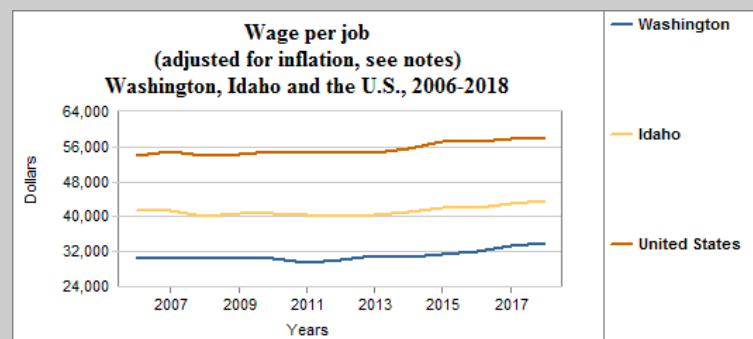


Employment

- The average annual unemployment rate in 2018 was 4.1%, compared to 2.8% for Idaho and 3.9% for the US. Washington County ranked 11th—from highest to lowest—out of Idaho's 44 counties.
- The largest number of jobs in 2018 were provided by government, farming, and manufacturing.
- The number of jobs was 4,623 in 2018, compared to 2,893 in 1969—a 60% increase.

- In 2018, the self-employment rate was 33.8%, compared to 25.7% for Idaho and 23.1% for the US.
- The average wage per job in 2018 (adjusted for inflation) was \$34,117, up from \$30,343 a decade earlier. The average was \$43,659 in Idaho and \$58,304 in the US.



Social Trends

Educational Attainment

In Washington Co. on average between 2014-2018...

- 14.1% of the population 25 years and older had no high school diploma, compared to 9.4% in Idaho and 12.3% in the US.
- 14.8% had a bachelor's degree or higher, compared to 26.9% in Idaho and 31.5% in the US.

Poverty

- Washington County's overall poverty rate decreased from 16.3% in 2008 when the recession began to 15.3% in 2018.
- Statewide, the overall poverty rate in 2018 was 11.7% and the US rate was 13.1%.
- Washington County's child poverty rate (for people under 18) decreased from 25.0% in 2008 when the recession began to 22.5% in 2018.
- On average between 2014 and 2018, the poverty rate for people 65 and over was 8.5 percent.

Washington County Youth

- The teen birth rate in 2017 was 5 per 1,000, compared to 6 per 1,000 in Idaho and 8 per 1,000 in the US.
- On average between 2014 and 2018, teens who were not working, looking for work, and not in school made up 8.7% of all youth aged 16-19, compared to 6.8% in Idaho and 6.8% in the US.

Crime and Law Enforcement

In Washington County in 2017...

- The total number of crimes reported was 26 per 10,000 population, compared to 186 in Idaho and 236 in the US.
- The number of sworn police officers per 1,000 population was 2.3, compared to 1.7 in Idaho and 2.1 in the US.
