

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

University of Idaho offers bachelor's degrees in Coeur d'Alene in partnership with North Idaho College. Lower division courses are offered through NIC, and upper division courses are through U of I Coeur d'Alene.

It is possible to take classes from both NIC and U of I at the same time. This might happen when you're nearly done with an associate degree and would like to get a head start before fully transferring to U of I.

HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

• ADMISSIONS

- If you plan to take both NIC and U of I courses, you'll need to apply with both institutions.

 - uidaho.edu/apply

• FINANCIAL AID

- Submit your FAFSA by Dec. 1 at fafsa.ed.gov to be considered for the maximum amount of financial aid for the next academic year.
 - U of I FAFSA school code: 001626
 - NIC FAFSA school code: 001623
- You can only receive financial aid through one institution per semester. Students must receive financial aid from the institution where they are ultimately degree-seeking. If a student is degree-seeking at both NIC (Associate's degree) and U of I (Bachelor's degree), their aid should come from the University of Idaho.

• REGISTRATION AT NIC AND U OF I

- Your first semester at NIC you must meet with an NIC advisor before registering for classes. As a U of I student, you must meet with your advisor every semester.

- Summer/Fall registration typically begins in April. Spring registration begins in October or November.

• PAYING YOUR FEES

- Concurrently enrolled students must remit fees to NIC and U of I separately.
- If you need to defer fees at NIC before the start of a term, submit a copy of your accepted and signed U of I award letter from Vandal Web to the NIC Student Accounts Office. Your financial aid must be sufficient to cover your NIC costs. If your U of I financial aid is insufficient to pay your NIC tuition, you are responsible for paying the difference in accordance with NIC's published dates.

• AT THE END OF THE SEMESTER

- Make sure you order an official NIC transcript and have it sent to the U of I Registrar's office. The transcript request form can be found at nic.edu/registrar.
