## PETITION FOR REINSTATEMENT AFTER ACADEMIC DISQUALIFICATION

If you are petitioning for reinstatement to the university, you must submit a letter prior to the beginning of the semester for which you are seeking reinstatement. Address your letter to the **College Academic Appeals Committee**. Your letter must include the following:

- Name
- Student V# Number (i.e. V00123456)
- Current Address
- Local Phone
- E-Mail Address
- Your Major
- Answers to the questions below:

## QUESTIONS PERTAINING TO ACADEMIC DISQUALIFICATION

Provide as much information as possible that you think will help support your case.

- 1. List honest, specific reasons why you did not do well academically the last semester that you were enrolled, as well as other semesters leading up to your disqualification.
- 2. List the classes you plan to repeat and the specific changes that you would make to improve your performance this next semester if you were reinstated.
- 3. What steps will you take to ensure your academic success? What resources will you use on campus to help you be academically successful? Who will hold you accountable?
- 4. Will you work while taking classes? If so, how many hours a week do you plan to work?
- 5. Have you completed any college-level coursework at another institution after your disqualification from the University of Idaho?
- 6. What are your academic and career goals? Why do you want to return to the University of Idaho?

Attach or fax all documentation that will support your case such as:

- Letter from your academic advisor.
- Letter from counselor or psychologist.
- Letter from physician if chronic health problems contributed to your academic difficulties.
