ELIGIBILITY

LEVEL

ElementaryStudents attending public, private, homeschool, or online
educational programs in Grades 6 and under.JuniorStudents attending public, private, homeschool, or online
educational programs in Grades 6-9.SeniorStudents attending public, private, homeschool, or online
educational programs in Grades 9-12.CollegeCollegiate students enrolled for the spring semester in which
the Festival occurs.

ACCOMPANIMENT

If necessary, older students, non-students, and/or pre-recorded tracks may serve as accompanists or additional ensemble members.

CATEGORIES

Solo	One performer with accompaniment of no more than 8 people.
Combo	An instrumental or vocal ensemble with 9 or fewer performers.
Ensemble	An instrumental or vocal ensemble with 10 or more performers.

VIDEO SUBMISSION

RECORDING

Equipment	Use whatever equipment you have available. This can be your phone, tablet, computer, etc.
Format	Live, edited, and collaborative/multi-track videos are all acceptable.
Required Introduction	Start your video by stating the group or performer's name and each piece being performed.

Performers will upload video files utilizing the submission link sent in the registration confirmation email. Submission deadline: February 11, 2022.

ADJUDICATION SESSION

Performers will receive feedback from a world-class artist educator either in-person on the University of Idaho campus or in a live Zoom meeting as selected during the registration process. Meeting links will be sent via email to participants prior to the festival.

COMPETITION RULES

SCORING

All entries will receive a score out of 100 in each of the categories listed below. An overall score out of 100 will be calculated using the indicated weighted percentages.

RESULTS

Directors will receive the following items via email by the end of each evening concert:

- **Scores -** overall and individual weighted categories
- Category/Division Rankings school and director names redacted
- Winner Results by Category as announced during the Evening Concert

WINNER RECOGNITION: MAIN COMPETITION

Placement	Performers with the highest overall scores in their category will be recognized as winners and runners-up, respectively.
Flacement	A panel of adjudicators will select winners based on performance recordings submitted prior to the festival. Only competitive entries will be eligible.
Announcements	All winners will be verbally announced and displayed on main stage video boards during the Evening Concert at 7:00 p.m. Winner results will also be provided to all directors with participating groups.
Awards	All first-place winners will receive a trophy which can either be picked up on stage at the Evening Concert or delivered to the mailing address collected during registration.

WINNER RECOGNITION: SWEEPSTAKES & AVISTA SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITIONS

	Outstanding Senior vocal and instrumental large ensembles (one each) will be selected as winners in the Vocal and Instrumental <u>Sweepstakes</u> Competitions, respectively.
Placement	Outstanding Senior vocal and instrumental soloists (two each) will be selected as winners in the Vocal and Instrumental <u>Avista Scholarship</u> Competitions, respectively.
	A panel of adjudicators will select winners based on performance recordings submitted prior to the festival. Only competitive entries will be eligible.
Announcements	All winners will be verbally announced and displayed on main stage video boards during the Evening Concert at 7:00 p.m. Winner results will also be provided to all directors with participating groups.
	A rotating Sweepstakes trophy and free admission into the subsequent year's Lionel Hampton Jazz Festival will be awarded to winners of the Vocal and Instrumental <u>Sweepstakes</u> Competitions.
Awards	One \$1,500 Avista scholarship and one \$1,000 Avista scholarship to put toward any degree at the University of Idaho will be awarded to first and second place winners of the Vocal and Instrumental <u>Avista Scholarship</u> Competitions, respectively.
