Instrumental Literature and Techniques (June 14-24, 2 cr)

Professor Robert Spevacek (UI) and Rodney Winther (Ithaca College, NY) offer a comprehensive look at building the strong school band program. Observation of Summer Music Camp 1983 ensembles will supplement the course of instruction.

Seminar in Secondary Music Teaching (June 14-17, 1 cr)

Dr. Lynn Skinner (UI) chairs a wide-ranging examination of practical and theoretical aspects of secondary music teaching. The seminar coincides with Summer Music Camp 1983 to provide observation opportunities with the camp ensembles.

Choral Literature (June 20-24, 1 cr)

Dr. Harry Johansen (UI) explores the careful selection of choral literature as a basis for building an excellent school choral music program. Observation of Summer Music Camp ensembles will augment instruction.

WSU String Chamber Music Week (June 20-24, 1 cr)

Professors Alan Bodman and Christopher Von Beyer of the Washington State University Department of Music coach chamber groups comprised of workshop participants. By cooperative arrangement, this may be taken for UI graduate credit.

Piano Technical Work and Tuning (July 15-16, 1 cr)

UI keyboard technician Everett Story conducts an intensive two-day workshop designed for pianists, teachers and persons interested in professional tuning. The course is offered on graduate and undergraduate levels and may be taken for WSU credit.
