ADJUDICATORS AND CLINICIANS

FREE FLIGHT

For several years this incredible Jazz quartet has amazed their audiences with an unbelievable mix of Jazz and Classical music. Their music ranges from Bach to Brubeck and from Debussy to Kellaway. This fine group features the flute of Jim Walker, principal flutist of the Los Angeles Philharmonic, keyboardist and composer Milcho Leviev, bass player Jim Lacefield, and percussionist Ralph Humphrey. This may be your first chance to hear a true Jazz/Classical union.

DIANNE REEVES

This fantastic performer returns to Jazz '84 after having totally captivated her audience in last year's festival. A professional singer since her teens, Dianne has performed with Jazz greats Clark Terry and Louie Bellson; been featured with Count Basie and Chick Corea; and recorded with Stanley Turrentine and Ronnie Laws. She has also toured as featured vocalist with Sergio Mendes.

SARAH VAUGHAN

Sarah Vaughan is a living, breathing Jazz legend whose star still shines as bright as ever. Downbeat Magazine has nominated her as Best Female Vocalist for 18 consecutive years. A 1981 Emmy winner for the PBS Television Special — "Sarah Vaughan Sings George Gershwin," she has also been nominated Best Female Jazz Singer by the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences for 8 consecutive years. In 1982 she won a Grammy for the Best Performance by a Female Vocalist.

BILL PERKINS, saxophonist.

He has toured and recorded extensively with the Woody Herman and Stan Kenton Orchestras. Currently a member of the Doc Severinsen Tonight Show Orchestra, he has also recorded as a leader of his own group and can be heard on several Steely Dan albums, as well as on a recent Woody Herman album. Bill is the inventor of the SAXOPHONE-SYNTHESIZER-INTERFACE currently being featured by Ernie Watts. Bill is also co-inventor of the TRUMPET-SYNTHESIZER-INTERFACE now being featured by trumpeter Al Vizzutti.

LIONEL HAMPTON

Still a favorite among the young, especially at a time when the renewed popularity of jazz is at its peak, Hamp has been busy doing shows at theatres, high schools, colleges and nightclubs around the country. High on his list of recent triumphs is the spectacular jazz special "One Night Stand," which reunited him with many of his old playing cronies, including Gene Krupa, Mel Torme, Buddy Rich, etc., and a hit Broadway revue with Bette Midler that broke all house records and was sold out through the entire 10-week engagement.

The jazz great's musical contributions to the world have become legendary. He has a host of awards and honors and even composed a major symphonic work, "King David Suite." Known widely as "King of the Vibes" and "Master of the Drums." Hamp has won the "vibes" seat in Playboy's Annual All-Star jazz and Pop Poll ever since its inception 18 years ago.


