

GUEST ARTISTS AND CLINICIANS

LIONEL HAMPTON

His grandmother thought she was giving him good advice when she said, "Boy, quit beatin' on those glasses and dishes with those spoons and go and dry them right! Put that silliness out of your head."

The little five-year-old drummer told his grandmother, "Mamma, I might be able to put drummin" out of my head, but I just can't seem to put it out of my heart!"

What his grandmother didn't know was that he would someday be "Master of the Drums" and "King of the Vibes."

Hampton started out playing the bass drum for the Chicago Defenders' Newsboys Band. His first job was with a teenage band formed by Les Hite.

Hampton began playing for a new band organized by Hite, playing backup to Louis Armstrong in the famous Cotton Club. Armstrong called on Hampton to join in a recording session with him and during a break, he wandered over to a vibraharp in the corner. Until then, the vibraharp was played for the "pretty sounds" it created, not as a jazz or melodic instrument. Hampton played a number on the vibraharp for Armstrong and it became a hit. From then on, Hampton was known as the "King of the Vibes."

His honors range from receiving a statehood award in Israel, being made a goodwill ambassador by the U.S. State Department, and chosen as the only male to be made an honorary member of Hadassah.

Hampton continues to amaze people with his enthusiasm and his concern for all people, raising millions of dollars for a Catholic Boys Home in Indianapolis, a Red Cross Hospital in Israel, and has held benefits to help send talented youngsters through school.

Luckily for his many fans around the world, he never did manage to put drumming out of his head or his heart.

New talent will be welcomed this year in the voice of **CLAIR BATHE**. Perhaps one of New York's finest young artists, Clair has been an understudy to Lena Horne on Broadway. She recorded on the Grammy Award winning album "The Lena Horne Cast Album," as well as being a vocal arranger for the "Lena Horne Show." Clair will make her Jazz Festival debut on the 8:00 p.m. concert Thursday, February 27.

LIONEL HAMPTON will headline the Friday, February 28, 8:00 p.m. All-Star Concert with guest artists ILLINOIS JACQUET, PETE CANDOLI, CONTE CANDOLI, DIANNE REEVES, and the accomplished RAY BROWN TRIO.

For ILLINOIS JACQUET, the Friday night concert will be a chance to appear once again with his old friend and bandleader, Lionel Hampton. He joined the Hampton band in the 1940s, and according to jazz critic Leonard Feather, it was Illinois' solo with Lionel Hampton's band on *Flying Home* that "attracted wide attention and, in effect, started a whole new school of big-toned, erotic tenor sax stylists." Illinois also worked with the bands of Cab Calloway and Count Basie; toured with Jazz at the Philharmonic units and his own band; and recorded with Count Basie, Ben Webster, Gene Krupa, and Buddy Rich, as well as his own group. He has been called "among the most formidable and soulful of tenor sax artists. The flaming emotional power that helped him gain fame with Lionel Hampton, Count Basie, and Jazz at the Philharmonic burns brightly through (his) collection of blues, ballads, standards and scorchers."

Called "the greatest living bass player in the world," RAY BROWN'S talent has brought him to the top of the jazz world. Early in his career he joined with Dizzy Gillespie, after which he formed his own trio with Hank Jones on piano and Charlie Smith on drums. He became a regular member of the Jazz at the Philharmonic ensemble, and toured with the Oscar Peterson Trio for fifteen years. Besides his own LP's, Ray Brown has recorded with a number of jazz greats, including Lionel Hampton, Oscar Peterson, Dizzy Gillespie, Charlie Parker, Louis Armstrong, Sonny Rollins, Stan Getz, Gerry Mulligan, and Sonny Stitt.

Also appearing on the All-Star concert are the trumpet playing Candoli brothers. **PETE CANDOLI** is regarded in the music world as one of the most precise and eloquent interpreters of jazz. As a trumpet player of major importance, Pete has been associated with the bands of Tommy Dorsey, Glenn Miller, Woody Herman, Stan Kenton, Les Brown, Count Basie, and others. He has in fact played with over twenty-seven top name bands. His powerful and aggressive style makes him best known for his jazz trumpet, but he is equally expert with classical and pop music. He has appeared on albums with top recording artists such as Michel Le Grand, Nelson Riddle, Billy May, Henry Mancini, Quincy Jones, and Frank Sinatra. In addition, Pete has won awards as outstanding trumpet player from Downbeat and Metronome magazines, and been recognized as one of seven all-time outstanding trumpet players by Esquire and Look magazines.

Younger brother CONTE CANDOLI, renowned as one of the world's top studio musicians, is probably on more recording sessions for movie, television, and records than any other living trumpet player. Conte is also highly visible as a member of the brass section in the NBC Tonight Show band where he has been a West Coast regular for the last ten years. His career began when he joined the Woody Herman band briefly at age sixteen, return to high school, then rejoined with Herman after his graduation. He played with many other major big bands of the time—Stan Kenton, Charlie Barnet, Benny Goodman, Jimmy Dorsey; and with some of the best known small jazz ensembles—Supersax, Charlie Ventura, and Shelley Manne, to name a few. Conte's expertise extends to recordings with big names in show business (Frank Sinatra, Big Crosby, Sammy Davis, Jr.) and contemporary artists such as Chicago, The Doobie Brothers, John Lennon, and Blood, Sweat, and Tears.

The spectacular jazz vocalist, **DIANNE REEVES**, a professional singer since her teens, has performed with Clark Terry and Louis Bellson, been featured with Count Basie and Chick Corea, and recorded with Stanley Turrentine and Ronnie Laws. She has toured the world as featured vocalist with Sergio Mendes, and has found the time to conduct numerous vocal jazz clinics for colleges and universities. Her unique sound and style encompass all the energy, creativity, and grace necessary to insure a tremendous future,

which has led to her being called the "Singer of the 80s."


LIONEL HAMPTON, with his boundless energy and enthusiasm, will be the star attraction for the 8:00 p.m. concert on Saturday, March 1, appearing with his own big band from New York. His guest star for this concert is DIZZY GILLESPIE. With puffed out cheeks behind the upturned bell of his horn, Dizzy has become the most easily recognized trumpet player of our time. He gained prominence as one of three instrumental stars featured with Cab Calloway's band in 1939-1941. By this time his style had developed some of the characteristics later known as bop. After leaving the Calloway band, Dizzy worked briefly with Ella Fitzgerald, Benny Carter, Charlie Barnet, Les Hite, and others, before joining Billy Eckstine's band in 1944. He was the co-leader of a combo with Charlie Parker and leader of several groups of his own. He kept his big bands going through the late forties, and employed strong players including Dexter Gordon, Sonny Stitt, John Coltrane, Phil Woods, Max Roach, Ray Brown, J.J. Johnson, Milt Jackson, Bud Powell, and Quincy Jones. Gillespie did not alter his basic trumpet style after 1947, but he remains much in demand as a favorite performer by jazz fans worldwide.

When BOBBY SHEW took up the trumpet at the age of ten, he wasn't planning on a career in music. It was only after playing as many as six nights a week throughout high school and then spending three years as the jazz trumpet soloist in the famed NORAD multi-service band that he became aware of the possibility. After leaving the NORAD band in 1964, Bobby joined the bands of Tommy Dorsey, Woody Herman, and Buddy Rich. As a lead player he toured with Della Reese, Paul Anka, Robert Goulet, Steve Allen, Elvis Presley, and Tom Jones. In 1973 he moved to L.A. to get re-involved in his development as a jazz soloist rather than as a lead player. He performed as a member of the combos of Bud Shank, Art Pepper, and Frank Strazzeri, among others; and played lead for the big bands of Don Menza, Neal Hefti, Bill Berry, Frank Capp-Nat Pierce, Oliver Nelson, Akiyoshi-Tabakin, and Louis Bellson. Bobby Shew will be the featured artist at the 5:30 p.m. concert on Saturday, March 1, performing with the Univer-

sity of Idaho Jazz Ensemble 1.





Rules Summary

Ensemble Structure

Instrumental Jazz Ensemble Division - The instrumental jazz ensembles should consist of at least 10, and not more than 24 players. These groups must perform jazz, not rock.

Vocal Jazz Ensemble Division - Vocal jazz ensembles should consist of at least 10, and not more than 24 vocalists. Up to six additional instrumentalists (who do not sing with the group) may be used. Maximum entry: 24 vocalists and 6 instrumentalists.

Vocal Combo Division and Instrumental Combo Division - Combos may enter if there are 9 or less players in the group. These groups must perform jazz, not rock.

Soloist Division - This division will be open to vocal and instrumental soloists. Each soloist will be responsible for his or her own rhythm section.

Performing Standards - Any group not following these regulations will be disqualified.

- 1. All groups will perform three charts, including one up-tempo and one ballad style chart; however, if you use a chart that has an extensive portion of each of the tempo classifications rather than separate up-tempo and ballad charts, you are only requried to perform two charts (in order to stay within the time limit).
- 2. Each group entered will have six different charts prepared. One of the charts to be performed by the group will be randomly chosen by the director by thorwing a dice over the shoulder.
- 3. The six charts must be listed on a sheet of paper and given to the person in charge at each performance location.
- 4. The randomly chosen chart may be programmed by the director.
- 5. <u>Combos</u> will be required to follow Rule 1 of Performing Standards but do not need to have six charts perpared as per rules 2 through 4.
- 6. There is a time limit of 20 minutes for each performing group, which includes set-up time, performance, and getting off the stage area. Groups going over the Time limit will be disqualified from the final competition.

Sight Reading

There will be sight reading for all competing groups with the exception of combos in the Jazz '86 Festival. The rating will not affect the outcome of the regular performance. There will be separate awards for sight reading.

Competition

Three outstanding ensembles will be chosen from each class of competition. The top group from each class will perform at the conclusion of their respective day's competition. In the event of a tie both groups will perform on the evening concert at which time the judges will make their final decision.

(Schools wishing to enter more than one large group in the festival may do so and may enter the second group one classification lower than the normal status. Any school may compete in a higher size classification if the director so desires.)




